

JOB TITLE: Maintenance Technician

A Maintenance Technician is responsible for keeping a facility operating and repairing any problems when they are discovered before they have a chance to worsen. A Maintenance Technician will usually be required to perform a wide range of repair tasks around a facility and on equipment

- Fixing potential safety hazards to avoid injuries
- Produce legible and accurate paperwork reflecting work performed
