WHAT IS A CHRISTENING?

During a christening your child will be baptized with water. It's the start of an amazing journey of faith for your child and a special day for all your friends and family. Follow the links to find answers to your questions and to explore all that a christening means, not just on the

EXPLORING MORE ABOUT WHAT A CHRISTENING MEANS

Your child is precious to you and precious to God. You want the very best for them, and so does God. You want them to make right choices in life, for themselves and for others.

A christening is just the beginning of this and so much more. Over the years to come, it's a journey you'll

share together with your child by:

- Being there for your child to talk to about the bigger questions of life – questions about hope, faith and love.
- Praying for your child through the ups and downs of their faith journey.
- Showing them practically how to make those good choices in life.
- Helping them to learn more about their Christian faith, through their church and in other ways.

So it's a commitment to start as you mean to go on.

GODPARENTS

Choosing the right people as godparents for your child is a big decision. Here are some key things which might help you decide:

- Godparents will be people who'll be in touch with your family for many years to come. They may be relatives or friends of the family.
- They'll be people who you know you can trust and who'll be there for your child to talk about the bigger questions in life; questions about faith, hope and love.
- They should feel ready to make some big promises about faith for your child in church.
- Every child should have at least three godparents, two of the same sex and at least one of the opposite sex to your child. You can have more than three godparents if you wish.
- Parents may be godparents for their own children, providing they have at least one other godparent.

Because of the very special role they have in supporting your child's faith journey, godparents must be baptized with one, ideally, being confirmed.



AT THE SERVICE

At baptism, parents and godparents make promises for the baby.

Parents and godparents are told in the service that it is their duty to bring up the child to fight against evil and to follow Christ. The vicar will ask the parents and godparents questions:

Priest: Do you turn to Christ?

Answer: I turn to Christ.

Priest: Do you repent of your sins?

Answer I repent of my sins

Priest Do you renounce evil?

Answer I renounce evil

The vicar, using holy oil will make the mark of a cross on the baby's/child's forehead. The baptism then follows. The child's candle is lit and the candle given to a parent or godparent.
