
- · Nothing here for me!
- I found it challenging to focus on the lessons and core concepts because of the strong emphasis on avoiding mistakes. I felt pressured to do things perfectly, which took away from my ability to engage with the material. Personally, I didn't find this teaching style effective for the way I learn. Although the professor mentioned that we could reach out with questions, I didn't feel comfortable doing so due to the highly critical tone of the instructions. Guidelines and rubrics were provided, but they were buried in the course shell and difficult to access.
- Clarity of discussion to instructions and how they relate to the paper
- I do not believe the professor is well-suited to teach this course. It often felt as though grades were influenced more by his personal opinions than by objective evaluation, which I find problematic. His assignment instructions were frequently vague or misleading, creating confusion rather than clarity. When students received low grades, the suggested remedy was to schedule a one-on-one meeting to advocate for themselves. I find this approach concerning. Grades should reflect the quality of a student's work and performance throughout the course, not their ability to argue for a different outcome. Requiring students to lobby for their grades places undue pressure on them and feels inappropriate. Additionally, the professor's communication through the portal often came across as self-serving. I found myself spending more time trying to decipher hidden expectations or tailoring my work to align with his views than genuinely engaging with the course material or developing my own perspective. This significantly detracted from the learning experience.
- Requiring video engagement was a great addition to the virtual climate! Making our final projects available to the class would have provided additional follow-up to connect with our classmates' respective studies and growth experiences. This portion of the class felt like solo development when there was an additional opportunity for community building. In addition to discussion posts exploring content and detailing our projects, I would have loved to see what my peers experienced through their academic research and cultural exploration.


- I have learned how to brainstorm and check my work more! I have been very scared to use Al but it's been helpful.
