CURRENT RESEARCH

A. Precision Medicine

In contrast to conventional medicine, precision medicine and health demands the knowledge of a unique individual as an n-of-1 vs 1-size-fits-all, biomarkers at the molecular and cellular level vs. imprecise lab test that may be meaningless for many reasons.

The study of genomics, personal and family history, metabolomics, hormones, microbiomics, bone studies (bone density and body composition), lifestyle and digital data (sleep, nutrition, fitness and apps that inform and monitor in real time) to optimize a health span that matches a lifespan, to detect, predict, reverse, and prevent emerging disorders of aging.

B. Reproductive Endocrinology

Periandropause and andropause in men – mechanism, hypothalamic-pituitary-gonadal interaction, role of hCG and Testosterone, Premenopausal, perimenopausal and menopausal physiology in women- hormonal dynamics; current and potential therapeutic modalities. Impact of mixed estrogen agonist/antagonist, Clomiphene, on bone turnover.

C. Male and Female Aging

Hypothalamic-Pituitary- Gonadal Function: Relationship to Metabolic Disorders, Diabetes, Insulin Resistance, Cardiovascular Disease, Neurodegenerative Disorders, Cancer, Osteoporosis
