













### Tress Maksimuk

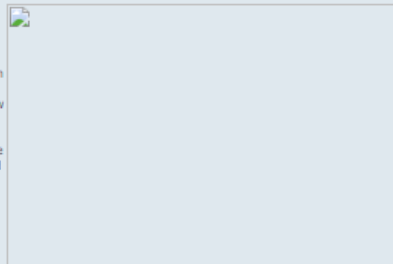
Tress Maksimuk, also known as the Dark Isle Piper, is a musician, composer, professional performer, recording studio artist and instructor of the Great Highland Bagpipes.

Tress was trained on the bagpipes in Redlands by the late Kevin Blandford, who founded the R.P. Blandford & Son Pipe Band, and her mentor and friend Madelyn Blandford... taught her how to sew her own kilt which you will see tonight.

She has become well known for her role as the bagpiper for the Starz television series Outlander. Her talents have been utilized by the Disney Interactive Studios working projects alongside legendary composer Richard Sherman.

While visiting Scotland on the Isle of Lewis, at the Callanish Stones, BBC Scotland Channel 3 Hebrides Island newscasters filmed her as she played the Bagpipes through the Stones.

According to Tress... "I am in LOVE with the Bagpipes! They bring me home to Scotland. The first time I heard a Pipe Band play it went straight to my heart and moved and inspired me to play. My hope is to ALWAYS bring the listener to Scotland and inspire others to embrace their Celtic Roots."

### A Note from Dr. Rob...

#### About Danzon #2: Just a Few Degrees of Separation

We have it on good authority (Wikipedia!) that:  
 "Arturo Márquez (born 20 December 1950) is a Mexican composer of orchestral music who uses musical forms and styles of his native Mexico and incorporates them into his compositions." GO FIGURE!  
 His Danzon #2 (the selection included in the April 20th concert), was commissioned by the National Autonomous University of Mexico and premiered in 1994.  
 Márquez was born in Álamos, Sonora, in 1950 where his interest in music began. He was the only one of the nine siblings who became a musician despite the fact that his father and grandfather were performing musicians. The other eight kids were probably smart enough to seek their fortunes in more respectable professions... "like doctors and lawyers and such!"  
 Arturo: studied at the Mexican Music Conservatory; earned a Master of Fine Arts degree from the California Institute of the Arts; was inspired to write his danzones after visiting a ballroom in Veracruz, Mexico where he was introduced to this music form originated in Cuba.  
 The piece became popular world-wide after it was played (in 2007) by the Venezuelan Simon Bolivar Youth Orchestra conducted by none other than the Los Angeles Philharmonic's Gustavo Dudamel (also Venezuelan!)  
 So, we have a Mexican composer, born in Sonora State, who went dancing in Veracruz, after having earned a Master's Degree in California whose composition based on a Cuban style was made widely popular by a famous Venezuelan conductor of a youth orchestra named after a South American revolutionary involved with the formation of the nations of Venezuela, Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Panama.  
 Like I said, just a few degrees of separation!

### A Note from Dr. Rob...

#### Freeze, Froze, Frozen

Disney Animated Movies, Disney Movie Music, and Disney Big Bucks--- In the case of the 2013 "highest grossing animated film of all time", FROZEN, big bucks to the tune of \$1.2 billion in world-wide receipts!  
 And all that from an adaptation of a rather dark tale by Danish author Hans Christian Andersen, The Snow Queen, which, according to what I've read, does not "translate easily into a film." But more on that below:  
 Obviously those at Disney Animation Studios weren't too worried about the darker side of the tale, and they can now boast about the two Oscars and a Golden Globe Award along with ten other awards for film, soundtrack and original song-"Let It Go".  
 The Disney film centers on the relationship of two orphaned princesses, one of whom has some magical powers which she uses against her sister and her world at large, sometimes intentionally, sometimes not...thus the plot turns!  
 Thematically FROZEN presents the universal struggle between good and evil as does the Andersen tale which is about evil trolls with a magic mirror that distorts the world and magnifies the "bad and the ugly".  
 The head troll, known as the "Devil" in the original, takes the mirror to Heaven so as to belittle the angels and God. As you might guess, this ill-conceived act did not work out exactly as planned---the bad guys and their mirror were sent crashing back to earth to be shattered into "billions" of pieces. There is nothing like that in the film. It is a Disney movie after all.  
 As for the sister princesses, the older one, the Snow Queen, (who has cryokinetic powers-ergo the Disney title) freezes things somewhat willy-nilly; including her younger sister's heart.  
 But, of course, in the end all is well, romance blossoms, and there is peace in the kingdom.  
 Like I said: "It is a Disney movie after all!"  
 A final add:  
 Andersen published The Snow Queen in 1844, four years after meeting and falling in love with the renowned Swedish opera singer Jenny Lind. Lind was having none of that and spurned Hans' romantic overtures; she was rewarded by having the icy-hearted Snow Queen modeled after her---or so I've read!  
 Enjoy the concert---there is plenty of great music!

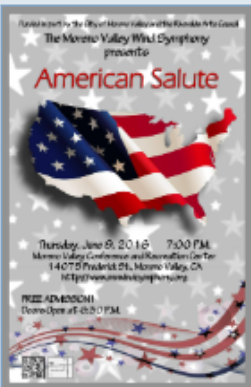

### A Note from Dr. Rob...

#### John Phillip Sousa and George Washington

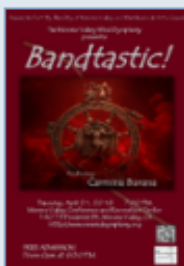
John Phillip Sousa, America's "March King" was actually born in Washington, D.C. a mere seven years before the start of the "War Between the States". While that conflict was raging, Sousa's father, a member of the U.S. Marine band, signed young John up as an apprentice musician. So it is not so hard to understand how he became the premiere composer of American military marches...including the National March of the United States, The Stars and Stripes Forever, and the official march of the U. S. Marines, Semper Fidelis. As to George Washington, "Father of the Country", Commander in Chief of the Continental Army during the "War for Independence", AND first President...well, what more is there to say? Perhaps these tidbits:  
 Chopping down the cherry tree: there is NO actual corroboration of such an event. Wooden false teeth? Nope. But he did have some made of elephant and hippo ivory and it is suspected that one set of teeth was contributed by numerous of his Virginia plantation slaves. (You knew he was a slave owner, right?).  
 Still, he was as greatly admired and trusted in his day as he is in ours. After all, we have a national day off from work named for him! But what's Sousa got to do with this?  
 On the 200th anniversary of George's birth, a Bicentennial Commission held a gala celebration. The climax of the celebration was a ceremony at the Capitol Plaza on February 22, 1932, for which Sousa composed the George Washington Bicentennial March and for which he conducted the combined bands of the U.S. Army, Navy, and Marine Corps.  
 Inexplicably, Sousa died just thirteen days after the premiere performance of the march; and this has led to the legend of "Washington's Curse" which is visited on anyone who conducts the march!  
 OK, just kidding; Captain Razo will be just fine after the June Concert.  
 By the way, this inventive march is considered one of Sousa's finest accomplishments. You'll be tapping your feet!

### A Note from Dr. Rob...

#### CARMINA BURANA

Carmina Burana is really an old gal, and quite the naughty one at that.

The original manuscript of 254 medieval poems (and dramatic texts) dates from the 11th or 12th Centuries, but was not codified until 1230. The poems were mostly written by students who satirized the Catholic Church. Of course, today young people would never make fun of the "establishment".

The manuscript consists of 55 songs of "ironies and mockery"; 131 love songs; and 41 drinking and gaming songs—with a couple of spiritual theater texts thrown in to keep the lady's reputation from being too lewdly. Other frequently recurring themes include: critique of greed in the church, lamentations about the ebb and flow of human fate or about death; pastoral songs about the seduction of sheepheadness by knights, students or clergymen (surely not clergymen); and Ovid's love poems. Ovid (The 1st Century Roman) and especially his erotic elegies were reproduced, imitated and exaggerated in the Carmina Burana. Must have been those wacky students again!

In Carl Orff's cantata (composed in 1935-6), the selection of songs covers a wide range of topics, as familiar in the 12th century as they are in the 21st century: the fickleness of fortune and wealth, the ephemeral nature of life, the joy of the return of Spring, and the pleasures and perils of DRINKING, GAMBLING, GLUTTONY AND LUST!

I told you Carmina could be a naughty girl!

### A Note from Dr. Rob...

#### Notes on Dartmoor, 1912

There are two arts to this story: On the one hand we have part of the John Williams score for the 2011 movie, *War Horse*; and on the other, the reference of the title of that piece to an actual place — which begs an explanation.

*War Horse* is an American film drama directed by Steven Spielberg adapted from Michael Morpurgo's 1982 children's novel of the same name set before and during the First World War.

In 1912, a teenage boy from Devon, England, witnesses the birth of a thoroughbred foal and subsequently watches with admiration the growth of the young horse. Much to the dismay of his mother, his father buys the colt at auction despite their needing a more suitable plough horse for their farm work.

Of course, if the hero of the story is a horse, then surely it will learn to plow; and under the devoted guidance of the boy it does. Yet as fate would have it, the farm's crops are destroyed by bad weather and the horse is sold to the army in order to pay the rent: a decision which it is believed will result in certain death for the horse as World War One has begun.

As the film follows the travails of the horse's life in the army, we see it first captured by the Germans, freed when his captors are killed; adopted by an orphaned French girl, re-taken by the German Army, then returned to the British Army by a coin toss in "No Man's Land" where the horse had become entangled in barbed wire and both a British and a German soldier had come to its rescue.

In the end, the horse is reunited with his original owner; but you might have guessed that; it is a children's story after all. As to the music's title: Dartmoor (now Dartmoor National Park) is a moorland in Devon County in the southwest of England. It is unique for its many ancient granite hilltops known as tors. The entire area is rich in antiquities and archaeology. Dartmoor, in fact, contains the largest concentration of Bronze Age remains in the United Kingdom.

But Dartmoor is also known for its myths and legends. It is reputedly the haunt of pixies, a headless horseman, a mysterious pack of "spectral hounds", and a large black dog, among others...and, yes, Dartmoor is the setting of Arthur Conan Doyle's *Hound of the Baskervilles*.

Williams' music captures Dartmoor as only he can; if you let it, this piece will take you on a most pleasant journey to the mysterious moors of Devon.
