CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE :

Brothers all,

June 6 this year, the day when parishes may resume public Masses, may be likened to “Easter”!! As we have all lived through isolation, uncertainty, and others-imposed restrictions for several weeks, which may be likened to an extended “Lent,” we are able to return to Mass and to Holy Communion. While there will be recognizable differences in how we gather in church, including fewer worshippers and the now customary social distancing, Jesus Christ is always present in each worshipper, the priest who celebrates Mass, in the Word of God, and especially in the Holy Eucharist; His Body and Blood. Essentially, Mass is not, and cannot be different then, and how gifted are we who can begin to return to Mass?

During much of the pandemic, our Brother Knight and seminarian, Brandon Schmidt, had live-streamed Sunday Mass; his efforts gave many parishioners and other virtual worshippers the opportunity to have a connection to Jesus. More were engaged by live-stream participation than by being in church; a beautiful and encouraging reality, to be sure. I give you a task, dear Brothers, based on your baptismal call to be apostles, namely, to invite your family members, neighbors, co-workers, and other Catholics whom you may meet who are “disconnected” from Mass to consider reconnecting. While Masses will be celebrated with fewer worshippers during the “Restricted Phase,” I think this is the moment to invite the “disconnected” to consider their return to the Mass and to sacraments.

As I firmly believe that God our Father is provident, so I believe this pandemic may bear fruits for many, particularly for those who may have fallen away from a relationship with Jesus.

I take this opportunity to thank my Brother Knights who had done some weeding around the parish grounds about two weeks ago, at Father Kelly's request, and who had helped me remove the hymnals from the church on May 28.

O Holy Mother of God.*



Dear Brother Knights,

It is with particular joy that I write to share with you the news that, at Noon today in Rome, the Vatican [announced](#) the formal recognition of a miracle attributed to our founder, Venerable Father Michael McGivney.

With this announcement, a Mass of Beatification will soon be scheduled.

This joyful news is the culmination of many years of determined effort, and I ask for your continued and increased prayers as we prepare for the day when our founder will be known as "Blessed Michael McGivney."

The Vatican announcement can be found below:

Decrees of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints

On May 26, 2020, the Holy Father Francis received in audience His Eminence Cardinal Angelo Becciu, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. During the audience, the Supreme Pontiff authorized the same Congregation to promulgate the Decrees regarding:

[...] the miracle, attributed to the intercession of the Venerable Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest, Founder of the Order of the Knights of Columbus; born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury (United States of America) and died in Thomaston (United States of America) on August 14, 1890; Venerable Michael McGivney was the founder of the Knights of Columbus, now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. After studies in Canada and the United States, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop James Gibbons in Baltimore. He founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, geared especially to working men and their families. He was known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died at the early age of 38 from pneumonia.

I would ask each brother Knight to learn more about our founder at the newly updated Father McGivney Guild website where the Order will also regularly post news and updates related to the beatification.

And if you would like to learn even more about our founder's heroic life and continuing legacy, please consider reading Father McGivney's biography, *Parish Priest*, and the newly-released book *The Knights of Columbus: An Illustrated History*.

MIRACLE APPROVED! FATHER MCGIVNEY TO BE BEATIFIED!

Priest launched international lay movement, died in 19th century pandemic

The Vatican announced that Pope Francis approved the promulgation of a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to the intercession of the founder of the Knights of Columbus, Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, a Connecticut priest who served his flock during the pandemic of 1890, before himself becoming ill and dying of pneumonia.

The pope's action means that Father McGivney can be declared "Blessed," the step just prior to sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint.

McGivney is best known for founding the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Nearly a century before the Second Vatican Council, his prescient vision empowered the laity to serve Church and neighbor in a new way. Today, the Knights of Columbus is one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world with 2 million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia, and Europe.

The miracle recognized as coming through Father McGivney's intercession involved an unborn child in the United States who in 2015 was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition after prayers by his family to Father McGivney.

A date will soon be set for the beatification Mass, which will take place in Connecticut. It will include the reading of an apostolic letter from the Holy Father and the bestowing of the title "Blessed" on Father McGivney.

Earlier this year, in an address to the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors, Pope Francis said the organization has been faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need."

"Father McGivney has inspired generations of Catholic men to roll up their sleeves and put their faith into action," Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said. "He was decades ahead of his time in giving the laity an important role within the Church. Today, his spirit continues to shape the extraordinary charitable work of Knights as they continue to serve those on the margins of society as he served widows and orphans in the 1880s. Father McGivney also remains an important role model for parish priests around the world and left us a transformative legacy of effective cooperation between the laity and clergy.

Father McGivney spent his entire priesthood in parish ministry and died of pneumonia on August 14, 1890—two days after his 38th birthday – after falling ill amid a pandemic. Recent scientific evidence indicates that that pandemic – like the current one – may have been [caused by a coronavirus](#).

I. Cause Opens

Dec. 18, 1997 – Father McGivney's Cause for Sainthood officially opened in Hartford by Archbishop Daniel A. Cronin. Father McGivney is given the title "Servant of God."



2. Diocesan Review Completed

March 6, 2000 – Closing of diocesan investigation into Father McGivney's life, holiness and virtues.



3. Positio Submitted to Rome

Summer 2002 – A 1,000-page document (*Positio*) laying out the case for Father McGivney's cause is presented to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints at the Vatican.




4. John Paul II Commends K of C and Founder

Oct. 2003 – In a message to the Knights of Columbus, St. John Paul II praised the Order and its founder: "In fidelity to the vision of Father McGivney, may you continue to seek new ways of being a leaven of the Gospel in the world and a spiritual force for the renewal of the Church in holiness, unity and truth."



5. Biography Published

July 2006 – *Parish Priest: Father McGivney and American Catholicism*, a biography by historians Douglas Brinkley and Julie Fenster, is published by William Morrow/Harper Collins.



10. Miracle Approved for Beatification

May 27, 2020 – After extensive medical and theological reviews, the Holy See announced that Pope Francis authorized a decree regarding the miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney, opening the way for his beatification.

9. Pope Francis Praises Father McGivney's Vision

Feb. 2020 – Pope Francis tells the K of C Board of Directors that the Order has been faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need." Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori presents Pope Francis with a copy of *Parish Priest* in Italian.



8. Miracle Investigated

Sept. 2017 – Results of an investigation into a possible miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney is sent to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.



7. Pope Benedict XVI Cites 'Exemplary American Priest'

April 2008 – During his visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, Pope Benedict XVI cited the "remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus."



6. Declared Venerable

March 15, 2008 – Confirming Father McGivney's heroic virtue, Pope Benedict XVI declared him a "Venerable Servant of God." The decree states, in part, "Concerning the theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love both toward God and neighbor ... they existed to a heroic degree in the Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest and Founder of the Fraternal Order the Knights of Columbus."

Keeping Things in Perspective

SOME FOOD FOR THOUGHT...

For a small amount of perspective at this moment, imagine you were born in 1900.

On your 14th birthday, World War I starts and ends on your 18th birthday. 22 million people perish in that war. Later in the year, a Spanish Flu epidemic hits the planet and runs until your 20th birthday. 50 million people die from it in those two years. Yes, 50 million.

On your 29th birthday, the Great Depression begins. Unemployment hits 25%, the World GDP drops 27%. That runs until you are 33. The country nearly collapses along with the world economy.

When you turn 39, World War II starts. You aren't even over the hill yet. And don't try to catch your breath. On your 41st birthday, the United States is fully pulled into WWII. Between your 39th and 45th birthday, 75 million people perish in the war.

Smallpox was epidemic until you were in your 40's, as it killed 300 million people during your lifetime.

At 50, the Korean War starts. 5 million perish. From your birth, until you are 55 you dealt with the fear of Polio epidemics each summer. You experience friends and family contracting polio and being paralyzed and/or die.

At 65 the Vietnam War begins and doesn't end for 20 years. 4 million people perish in that conflict. During the Cold War, you lived each day with the fear of nuclear annihilation. On your 62nd birthday you have the Cuban Missile Crisis, a tipping point in the Cold War. Life on our planet, as we know it, almost ended. When you turn 75, the Vietnam War finally ends.

Think of everyone on the planet born in 1900. How did they endure all of that? When you were a kid in 1985 and didn't think your 85year old grandparent understood how hard school was. And how mean that kid in your class was. Yet they survived through everything listed above.

Perspective is an amazing art. Refined and enlightening as time goes on. Let's try and keep things in perspective. Your parents and/or grandparents were called to endure all of the above and




The following procedure has been approved by Supreme Master Dennis Stoddard and Vice Supreme Master Michael Thumm. However, my preference would be for all parties to fill out the Form 4 with ALL pertinent information and signatures, scan the document and email it to the next person, with the completed form 4 ultimately being sent to District Secretary Jim McCarthy not later than 18 June. If that process cannot be used, then the following may be used. The fee for this special, virtual Exemplification is set at \$50. It is vital that we have a valid email address and phone number for all candidates. Every candidate will receive an email from the District Master inviting them to the Virtual Exemplification which will occur using the **GoToMeeting** platform.

How to process a form 4 for an online Exemplification during the Covid-19 Pandemic.

If you have recruited a candidate for the 4th degree, please handle the form 4 in the following manner.

- Phone your Faithful Navigator and give him complete information over the phone or via email so he can complete the Form 4. Complete means, Full Name, Address, Council Number, Membership Number, Phone Number, DOB, Parish, 1st degree date. Give the Faithful Navigator permission to sign your name and add your membership number to the proposer portion of the Form 4. Give the Faithful Navigator the name and phone number of the Council's Financial Secretary.
- The Faithful Navigator will call the Financial Secretary of the candidate's council to determine the standing of this candidate in the 3rd degree council. If this member is in good standing, the Faithful Navigator will ask the FS if he can sign the FS portion of the form 4.
- The Faithful Navigator will then contact his assembly's officers via phone, email, or conference call to vote on the candidate, ask any questions, and determine if this candidate will be accepted into the Assembly.
- Once the candidate is approved, the Faithful Navigator will sign the Faithful Navigator & Faithful Comptroller portion of the form 4 (No digital signatures).
- The Faithful Navigator will phone the candidate and review the form 4, review the details of the upcoming virtual exemplification from date, what platform that will be used, how to connect, how much the cost of the exemplification and where and who (District Master) to send the check for the exemplification fee to, give him the information on the assembly, that includes programs, regular activities, honor guards, yearly dues, how the councils and Assembly work together in a Patriotic way. He will let the candidate ask any questions he has on the assembly or the exemplification.
- The Faithful Navigator will then ask permission to sign the applicant portion of the form 4.
- Lastly, the Faithful Navigator will scan the completed Form 4 and email it to the District Secretary.
- The District Secretary will contact the candidate and review the information on how to connect to the exemplification and use the Form 4 to track those attending the online exemplification.
- After the exemplification, the District Master will take the scanned copies of all Form 4's and email them to the Supreme Master's office and mail the exemplification report and check to the Supreme Master's office.

Candidate Instructions for the Virtual 20 June 2020 Fourth Degree Exemplification.

If you have recruited a candidate for the 20 June 2020 Virtual Fourth Degree Exemplification, please make sure he understand the following prior to the scheduled Exemplification.

- One week prior to the Exemplification, phone the Assembly's Faithful Navigator and make sure he has completed the Form 4 and forwarded the Form 4 to the District Secretary.
- Phone your candidate and ask him to download the "GoToMeeting" app (The app is free) to his computer, iPad, or laptop. The Exemplification will include the normal slides and the audio presentation from the team. Phones are too small and may not be adequate for this purpose.
- Ask him if there are any questions prior to the Exemplification. Remind him of all the Programs and Activities of the Assembly he is joining and make plans to take him to his first meeting as soon as possible. In the meantime, be sure to invite him to the Assembly's virtual meetings.
- Make sure he has mailed the \$50 Exemplification fee to District Secretary Jim McCarthy.
- Ask him to prepare for the Exemplification by participating in the Exemplification in a quiet room where he can have privacy and be engaged in the Exemplification without distractions. Let him know the Exemplification will last 90-120 minutes, so be prepared to be in his private location for that length of time without a break.
- Let him know that when he logs into the GoToMeeting site on the day of the Exemplification, he is to opt for the AUDIO Only, do not turn on the video portion of the link.
- The District Master will send the link to the Exemplification meeting in advance, make sure he received the invitation and link.
- We are asking Candidates to log into the meeting at least 30 minutes prior so we can ensure we get an accurate roster for the Exemplification.
- A report will be generated at the end of the Exemplification with the names and duration of each person on the call. So, your candidate must remain on the call until the end to be counted.
- The District Master would like to Knight the New Sir Knights and present their Certificates, baldric, and lapel pin (PG-113) at an Assembly meeting or Installation. However, the Faithful Navigator, with the District Master's permission, may Knight the new Sir Knight and present him with his Certificate, Social baldric, and lapel pin (PG-113).


