### Words to Live By

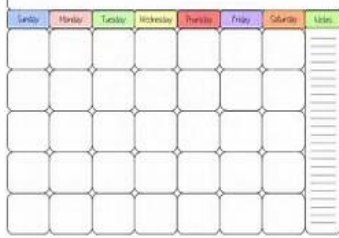
**Jesus promises that those who believe and follow Him
