My Brother Knights,

I am blessed and humbled to be a spiritual father, and experience moments of joy and sadness, depending on my "children's" life experiences. I know God is present to me, and have learned the absolute benefit of daily prayer to sustain me in my fatherly role. While I know many of you are fathers, each of us as a man is called to an intimate relationship with God, perfectly revealed in Jesus, the Son of Man. There is truth to a father's practice of the faith being more effective than a mother's in instilling the practice of the faith in their children. Brothers, whether we are fathers or not, our common need is an intimate relationship with Him the Eternal Father.

Prayer, defined as "the raising of our minds and hearts to God," takes many forms. In our Catholic faith, the best communal prayer is the Mass, and while communal prayer is necessary, we need personal prayer as well. 

Floyd Patterson: Heavyweight Champ and Knight

Floyd Patterson was one of the greatest boxers of all time, with 55 wins, an Olympic gold medal, and two Fighter of the Year awards. In 1991, he was Inducted into the International Boxing Hall of Fame.

While heavyweight champion, Patterson converted to Catholicism in 1957.

He joined the Knights of Columbus in New Paltz, NY and became a "mainstay" of Knights' events. He also helped his parish by distributing Holy Communion at the local nursing home, calling himself "the Eucharistic minister with the biggest hands".

Your Assembly needs some help. If you have been wondering how you can better serve the Assembly, wonder no longer.

Have you considered volunteering to be a member of the Assembly's Color Corps or Honor Guard?

The Color Corps are 4th Degree Sir Knights who, dressed in the officially designated Fourth Degree member regalia dress as set forth in the Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree (Article XI, "Official Dress and Regalia," Sections 38 and 40, <u>https://www.kofc.org/en/resources/service/council/1350_Laws_and_Rules_2013.pdf</u>), participate in ceremonies such as Church functions, installation of new pastors, and so forth, as requested. The Assembly's current Color Corps Commander is Sir Knight Bob Thompson who does an excellent job.

The Honor Guard are 4th Degree Sir Knights who stand as Chalice Guards on either side of the coffin, say the opening and closing prayers, and present a certificate of condolence to the next-of-kin. In most cases, the Knights standing Chalice Guard do so in ten-minute shifts.

The territory served by the St. John Neumann Assembly is divided into the Upper and the Lower areas with each area having a chairman. The Upper and Lower areas are determined by the location of the church or funeral home where the Honor Guard will stand guard. The dividing line is approximately the northern border of the city of Philadelphia. If the church or funeral home is north of that line, it will be the responsibility of the Honor Guard Chairman – Upper, and if it is located south of that line, it will be the responsibility of the Honor Guard Chairman – Lower.

Presently, Color Corps Commander Sir Knight Bob Thompson serves as the Honor Guard Chairman – Upper, but the Assembly needs a Sir Knight to serve as the Honor Guard Chairman – Lower. As Honor Guard Chairman, you would be required to notify Assembly members via email of Honor Guard call-outs among other duties which would include obtaining the names and addresses of the next-of-kin, completing the certificate of condolence and presenting it to the next-of-kin at the end of the Honor Guard participation, and providing a sign-in sheet for the participating Knights.

NEW 4TH DEGREE UNIFORM INCENTIVE PROGRAM

As you may know, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus has changed the official 4th Degree uniform. This change was effective January 1, 2021.

The uniform of the 4th Degree is and has always been an identifying factor of the 4th Degree Assemblies of the Knights of Columbus. Our Assembly, Saint John Neumann Assembly #933, has used the Color Corps and uniformed Brothers for many years in various activities, including special Masses and Honor Guards for our deceased Brothers.

The current price of the new uniform is slightly over \$400 not counting alterations.

Your officers, with the interest and intent to remain compliant and to continue to participate in events, proposed and the Assembly, at its Conclave on February 24^{th} , unanimously approved the following 4^{th} Degree Uniform Incentive **Program**:

Saint John Neumann Assembly #933 4th Degree Uniform Incentive Program

- 1. Any officer or Color Corps Commander currently serving a term with the Saint John Newman Assembly #933 may request a \$200.00 reimbursement for the price of a paid uniform. Proof of payment is necessary. This is a subsidy by the Assembly.
- 2. Any officer or Color Corps Commander currently serving a term with the Saint John Newman Assembly #933 may request a \$400.00 advance payment to purchase a new uniform. Repayment in the amount of \$200.00 will be made at a minimum of \$20 per month and not exceed 12 months. At this time and in the future, repayment will be managed by SK Michael Ciampoli. The remaining \$200.00 will be a subsidy provided by our Assembly. Forms will be provided.
- 3. Any member in good standing with the Saint John Neumann Assembly #933, can, upon proof of purchase of a uniform, request to receive a \$100.00 reimbursement upon completion of three Color Corps "Call Outs" in one fraternal year. The maximum amount of the reimbursement is not to exceed \$200.00 over two fraternal years. Qualifying Color Corps call outs will be subject to the approval of the Faithful Navigator and Faithful Admiral.
- 4. Funding for this proposal shall initially come from the existing Color Corps fund.
