CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Musings For "Rays of Mary"

Brothers all,

As I write on Monday of the First Week of Lent two words quickly come to mind;, fasting and repentance. While adults from 18-59 years of age are required to limit themselves to one full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, for the sake of a little self-sacrifice, fasting is more than these basic requirements for people of all ages. Fasting is not only about limited food consumption, and we know the value of other kinds of self-sacrifice, perhaps especially during Lent. Do you watch too much TV? Do you spend too much time away from your family at home for your own interests? Do you use your phone too much, instead of being with, and conversing with your family? Are you simply too busy to pray? Will you limit what distracts you from time with your family; time with God? Your answers expand what fasting is.

I unhesitatingly speak and write about the Sacrament of Reconciliation often. As every sacrament has "matter" and "form", we penitents are required to confess all the sins we are aware of after a careful examination of conscience, to be truly contrite for those sins, and to make satisfaction (do the penance given by the priest) for those sins. These acts are the "matter" of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, while the words of absolution by the priest are the "form" of this sacrament. Each of us is called to repentance throughout our lives because of our fallen human nature from the Original Sin. I think Satan subtly has led many away from the Sacrament of Reconciliation by their being afraid of forgiveness, the result of repentance. The minimal requirement for Catholics, the "Easter duty", is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation once a year, during the Easter Season, so to worthily receive Holy Communion. Please remember - the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion are frequent sacraments, for abundant graces. Please celebrate these sacraments frequently for your soul's health, and invite others too. Repentance is not only for Lent.

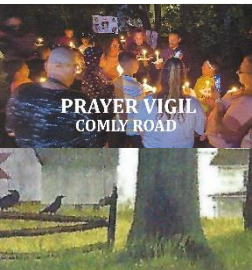

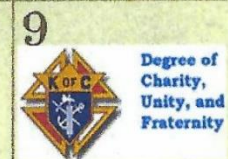

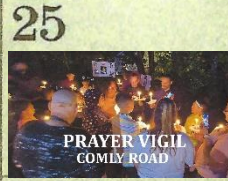

Thoughts from the Seminary with Brandon Schmidt

On this first Sunday of the holy season of Lent, we hear in today's Gospel of the temptation of Jesus in the desert. I have always found this Gospel passage comforting because it further reveals the greatness of the mystery of God becoming man.

When we pray to Jesus asking for His help in our temptations, it is not as if He is removed from them or tries to empathize with us out of pity, but rather He fully understands our temptations because He suffered through them Himself. Yet He has overcome them as the perfect human without sin. Notice in the Gospel that Jesus retreats to the desert where He is tempted.

Pope Benedict XVI described the desert as a place of "abandonment and loneliness" where temptation becomes stronger. However, it can also indicate "a place of refuge and shelter, as it was for the people of Israel who escaped from slavery in Egypt." The desert is a place "where we can experience the presence of God in a special way." In a certain sense, we are being called to the desert during this season of Lent through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

These three pillars of Lent, when practiced to their fullest, can seem isolating because we can see ourselves spiritually moving farther away from our worldly desires, although the temptations are still present. Yet at the same time, we soon find ourselves in a place of refuge and shelter because we notice all the more God acting in our lives and giving us His comfort in what can be a difficult place.

Jesus' temptation in the desert highlights that even He who is God practiced the three pillars. His prayer and fasting are obviously seen in the desert, but what about almsgiving? His entire life, essentially, is an act of almsgiving to all of us as He is the perfect sacrifice acceptable to God to take away our sins.

This period of temptation takes place right after His baptism and is Christ's preparation for His public ministry, which was all for us. We see in the first reading the fall of humanity. Jesus Christ was never the Father's "plan b" after humanity fell, God the omniscient knew we would fall. In the great mystery of redemption, humanity as now redeemed becomes greater than before the Fall because of Christ.

We will proclaim this in the Easter Vigil in the Exultet: "O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!" Christ has given his entire life as an almsgiving to us poor sinners. As we have seen Christ practice the three pillars of Lent in the Gospel, I pray that we all have a fruitful Lent as we practice these too. I pray that as we prepare for the great Paschal Mystery, we become more aware of the great sacrifice of Christ and the triumph of Easter as we deepen our relationship with Him along the way.

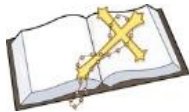

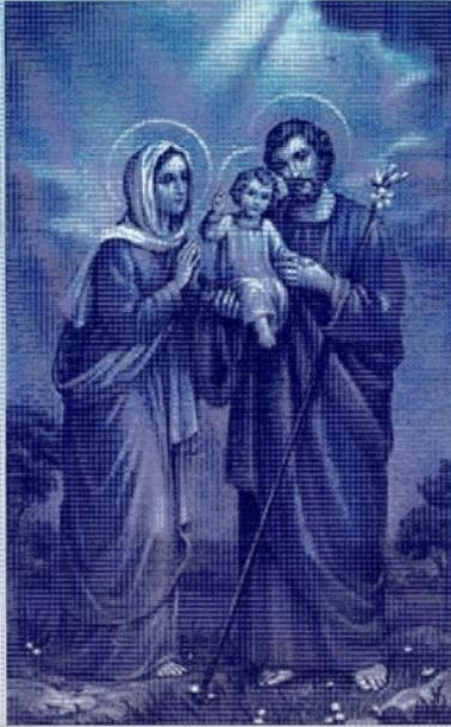
Words to Live By

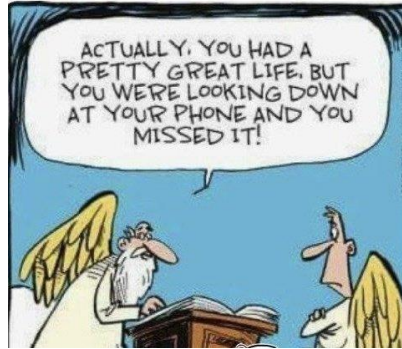

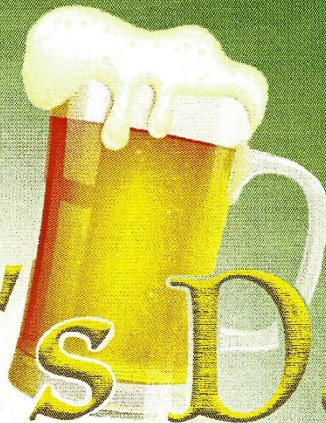

Meat On St Patrick's Day? Philly Archdiocese Says It's Ok



PHILADELPHIA — Philadelphia area Catholics have been given permission to gobble up meat in celebration of St. Patrick's Day.

Reverend Nelson J. Pérez of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia Thursday granted a dispensation to all Roman Catholics in the archdiocese from their obligation to avoid meat on the holiday.

This year, St. Paddy's Day falls on Friday, March 17.

With the announcement, area Catholics can eat all the corned beef on the holiday as their hearts desire without fear of breaking Lent.

According to the archdiocese, the dispensation is in line with the church's Code of Canon Law.

Typically, all Catholics 14 and older are obliged to avoid meat on Fridays during Lent.

However, Diocesan Bishops can grant exceptions when celebrations such as St. Patrick's Day fall on Fridays. Catholics are encouraged to give up something else as a penitential act in lieu of avoiding meat on St. Patrick's Day, according to the archdiocese.

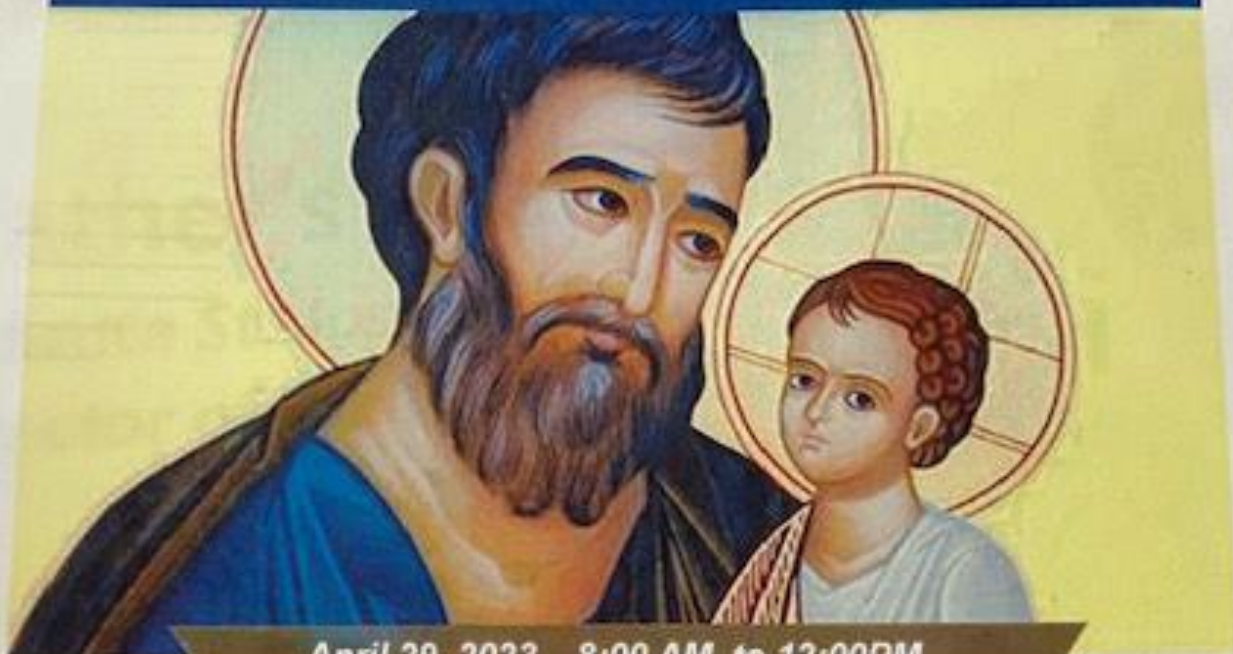
