#### CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

#### Brothers all,

I believe the Holy Spirit strongly invites me to speak and write more about the Flame of Love of the Immaculate Heart of Mary; a way of life which was "born" from the Diary of Elizabeth Kindelmann, an ordinary wife and mother from Hungary who had received messages from the Blessed Mother and Jesus from 1961 until 1982.

This worldwide way of life is about renewal, as Jesus had communicated to Elizabeth: "The renewal of the earth will take place through the power and imploring force of the Blessed Virgin Mary".

Are we not keenly aware of the reality of evil? The genesis of evil is the Original Sin; undoubtedly, Jesus has redeemed us for eternal life and we live in the present time while battling temptations and choices to sin.

In our usual life of faith, we experience renewal by way of choices to resist temptations, prayer, acts of charity, celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation and participation in Mass.

As I refer to the Flame of Love of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I refer to what is already familiar to all of us; Jesus and the Blessed Mother. Jesus is the Flame of Love born of the Immaculate Virgin Mary. 
## **Missing Knights**



## MAY – MARY'S MONTH

For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of Mary to honor Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day *in* May, mind you, but the entire month.

The custom spans both centuries and cultures, with roots going back as far as the Ancient Greeks. In early Greece, May was dedicated to Artemis, the goddess of fecundity.

In Ancient Rome, May was dedicated to Flora, the goddess of blooms, or blossoms. They celebrated *ludi florals*, or floral games, at the end of April and asked the intercession of Flora for all that blooms.

In medieval times, similar customs abounded, all centering around the practice of expelling winter, as May 1st was considered the start of new growth. During this period, the tradition of *Tricesimum*, or "Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary," came into being. Also called, "Lady Month," the event was held from August 15-September 14 and is still observed in some areas. The idea of a month dedicated specifically to Mary can be traced back to baroque times. Although it wasn't always held during May, Mary Month included thirty daily spiritual exercises honoring Mary.


It was in this era that Mary's Month and May were combined, making May the Month of Mary with special devotions organized on each day throughout the month. This custom became especially widespread during the nineteenth century and remains in practice until today.

The ways Mary is honored in May are as varied as the people who honor her.

It's common for parishes have a daily recitation of the Rosary during May, and many erect a special May altar with a statue or picture of Mary as a reminder of Mary's month. Additionally, it's a long-standing tradition to crown the statue of Mary during May — a custom known as May Crowning. Often, the crown is made of beautiful blossoms representing Mary's beauty and virtue. It's also a reminder to the faithful to strive to imitate our Blessed Mother's virtue in our own lives. May Crowning, in some areas, is a huge celebration and is usually done outside of Mass, although Mass may be celebrated before or after the actual crowning.







As we are entering Mary's month, I am reminded that we all received a rosary at our first-degree ceremony and that we promised to carry and say the rosary.

I wonder how many of us still do.

# R S Y P



The Knights of Columbus launched the **R**efund **S**upport **V**ocations **P**rogram (RSVP) in 1981. Under this program, local K of C councils or assemblies agree to make an annual contribution of \$500 or more to an individual seminarian to help with his expenses. Councils and assemblies can sponsor more than one seminarian if their resources permit. In each case, the minimum annual contribution is \$500 per seminarian. For every \$500 donated, the council or assembly is eligible for a refund of \$100 from the Supreme Council.

The usual contribution is \$500 per seminarian but, this year, the Regina Mundi council has voted to contribute \$600 for each seminarian. This gives the refund to the seminarian.

# From The Desk Of David J. Bloomer, PFN Deputy State Life Director



Worthies and Brothers:

I have a few items of interest for your review...

**PA March for Life**: This year's Pennsylvania March for life will take place **Monday, October 16, 2023**. This year's march is about a month later than last year. Hopefully, the weather will be a bit more pleasant than the heat, humidity, and thunderstorms we had to endure at the 2022 march.

The PA March for Life Committee has graciously asked me to once again be our liaison for planning and logistics (this should get us stage access for State Chaplain Father Rossi and State Deputy Mike Kish again). More information will obviously be available later this year as we get closer to the march.

State Pro-Life Constitutional Amendment: I've been told that a main theme of the march will be the status of the proposed state constitutional amendment; to prevent both carte blanche protection of abortion as well as its public funding. Unfortunately, it appears that the intention of recently-installed House Speaker Rozzi (D?/I?) was to delay/postpone most House business until the special elections to fill the vacancies occurred on February 7, which were all won by the Democratic candidates. This now gives the PA House a 102-100-1 Democratic majority, making the slim chance of re-passing the amendment and sending it over to the Senate virtually impossible for now.

However, with a razor-thin majority, sudden changes may occur that would perhaps enable further consideration of the amendment before the end of 2024. Keep praying. I'd like to think that Pennsylvania has a better moral compass than other states that enshrine infanticide in their laws.

<u>Silver Rose:</u> For 2023, Pennsylvania will be on **Route 4**; we will have custody from **August 13** (when we receive it from **West Virginia**) to **September 16** (when we hand if off to **New Jersey**). I will contact our handlers in the near future to confirm that they can once again be our trusted custodians. They did a fantastic job last year of not giving me any ulcers while we had the Silver Rose – thanks to all!

The Convention Committee has requested that all Assemblies ask their Color Corps members to bring their Regalia for the Convention Masses.







On Holy Thursday morning, the Archbishop, joined by the priests of the diocese, gathered at the Cathedral to celebrate the Chrism Mass. This Mass manifests the unity of the priests with their bishop. Here the bishop blesses three oils — the oil of catechumens (oleum catechumenorum or oleum sanctorum), the oil of the infirm (oleum infirmorum) and holy chrism (sacrum chrisma) — which will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the diocese for the year. This tradition is rooted in the early Church as noted in the Gelasian Sacramentary (named after Pope Gelasius I, d. 496), but was later absorbed into the Holy Thursday evening Mass; Pope Pius XII issued a new Ordinal for Holy Week, which reinstituted a special Mass of the chrism distinct from the evening Mass.


