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The obstacle in the path of Assamese People.

In ancient times, there was a tribal King named Jungal Balahu in middle part of Assam. His capital was in Jungal Balahu Garh near Raha, in Nagaon district. The subjects of Jungal Balahu became lethargic but used to criticize the king for poor condition of roads and other amenities every day. One day the King placed a boulder on a roadway.
