(Washington, DC) - In a moment that was equal parts heart and heritage, *The United States Presidential Service Center's* Distinguished Service Medal (DSM) was awarded to **Mr. Bryon Wiebold** and **Mr. Dave Harrison** for lives spent in service to others — a rare salute that celebrates grit, compassion, and community impact during this year's December meeting of the Veteran Ready Summit at the American Transportation Associations headquarters in Washington, DC.

The Distinguished Service Medal — conceived in 2008, honed through years of thoughtful design and ethical standards, and dedicated to recognizing exceptional dedication to society — now shines upon two remarkable recipients whose work lifts veterans and communities alike.

Bryon Wiebold — Champion for Veterans' Well-Being

Mr. Bryon Wiebold, serial number 1821, receives the DSM for his tireless advocacy in preventing veteran suicide and his steadfast support of *Wreaths Across America* — a movement that ensures fallen heroes are remembered with dignity. Through this work, Bryon brings hope and action to a cause that matters deeply to families and comrades nationwide.

Dave Harrison — A Lifetime of Service and Opportunity

Mr. Dave Harrison, serial number 1822, is honored for a lifetime of military and law enforcement service, coupled with extraordinary contributions in helping over 28,000 people and over 10,000 veterans transition into meaningful careers. His work exemplifies

dignified service and real-world impact — turning sacrifice into success for those who served.

The United States Presidential Service Center Distinguished Service Medal is a civilian honor established to recognize individuals whose lives reflect extraordinary service, ethical leadership, and meaningful contributions to society.
