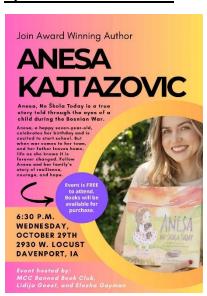

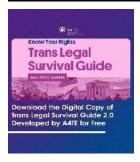

Project NOW begins its annual Energy Assistance program in Illinois QCA counties to help households keep warm this fall and winter.

The program assists income-eligible households with natural gas, propane and/or electric bills and furnace assistance for broken heating systems, Project NOW said in a news release.

Beginning Wednesday October 1st, the program said it will begin taking applications in Henry, Mercer and Rock Island counties for:

- older adults 60 years old and older
- · individuals with a disability
- families with children under the age of 6
- households that are:
 - o disconnected from their utilities o

have a disconnection notice o

have less than 25% in their propane tank

Officials said all other income-eligible households can start applying on Nov. 1. Applications will be taken on a first-come, first-serve basis through Aug. 15, 2026, or until funding is exhausted, officials said.
