Weekly Inspiration

Are You Aware of Being Aware? by Pastor Rich



Consciousness is a strange animal. We used to think only humans were self-aware, but there is increasing evidence that self-awareness is a common trait in several other species. Most of the time we are not aware of being aware - for example, we have all had the experience of driving a car and we are so busy talking to someone or caught up in our own thoughts that we realize we were on auto-pilot, with little memory of what we saw along the way.

When we are really "self-conscious" - that is, fearful or unsure of ourselves, we become awkward. Sometimes I have had the experience of feeling like I am outside of my body, closely observing myself, as if I were watching someone else in a movie. Fortunately, it doesn't last long, and in an instant we are "brought back to ourselves" or "brought back to the real world."

Even at the sub-atomic particle level, muons and quarks' existence/properties depend on being observed by a conscious observer. We are never really alone. This is not a conversation I would want to have with someone who suffers from paranoia, but in ways that we cannot begin to comprehend, God is "watching" us.

The "all-seeing eye" is a symbol, also known as the "Eye of Providence," representing the allseeing, watchful, and protective gaze of a higher power. Most of us are comfortable calling that higher power God. The Eye appears on our dollar bill. It is there because it is a symbol used by the Freemasons. It's often depicted as an eye within a triangle and surrounded by rays of light. The symbol has been used since ancient times and appears in various cultures and belief systems.

I have always been fascinated by the interplay between science and theology. Science tells us that our observing things affects those things observed. How much more so does it apply to our relationships with others. Relationships can be quite complex and many-leveled. Yet everything we do in connecting with God or with others matters. Makes a difference. Affect us and them both. Creates ripples, as Dick Kennedy would say.

I believe God and God's creation are much more marvelous than we can ever comprehend. The ways that we are connected with all living things - even perhaps inanimate objects - is mind boggling to me.

Two thoughts on how all this applies to our faith. First, we tend to underestimate the difference we can make in others' lives. Jesus seemed intuitively to know what to say and do to make a difference in the lives of those he encountered. He mostly did this through his presence and his stories (parables) rather than preaching. He got them thinking about things in a new way! We can always grow to be more loving, to create more ripples!

Second, we should have a healthy dose of the mysteries of God in our faith. Knowing that we can't possibly understand it all has a way of making us humble before God's majesty in the best of ways. Take some time to be awestruck by your world. Let it mellow you to a state of gratitude for all that you experience. And when you are so reflecting, I believe that you are connecting with God and that God returns that reflection with energy and wonder for your soul.

Go about your week with an awareness of yourself as a child of a loving God who is always aware of you!
