



Weekly Inspiration



Sowing Seeds of Kindness by Pastor Rich

Jesus' Parable of the Sower is found in Matthew, Chapter 3 and Luke, Chapter 8. In it Jesus says we are good stewards of God's love when we scatter our seeds of kindness to the wind (ok, a paraphrase interpretation).

Too often we are so careful with our love — as if we have a limited amount; as if it is so fragile; as if it matters that someone might see how extravagant we are with it. I know people who radiate love and kindness. They are always ready to sow seeds. And they are happy people.

They are not necessarily the richest people or the healthiest people or the most handsome people. Yet they are happier than most of their cohorts.

First, we must unburden ourselves of that which does not serve us well. Addictions, grudges, our sense of entitlement. Then we can ask the Spirit to fill us with all the fruits of the spirit described in Galatians 5:22-23: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

After all, there's no law against such things!

To use a different metaphor read Ecclesiastes 11: cast your bread upon the waters - it will eventually return to you. A hug here, a conversation with a stranger there, a donation for the hungry, standing with protestors for justice. Who knows what good trouble you might be capable of?
