From the Pastor's Study...

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of darkness-on them a light has shined...For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9: 2b, 6)

The season of Advent is already upon us, I feel like it has (once again) come so quickly this year! There are lots of wonderful things that I look forward to about this unique season. We have moved from autumn to winter outside, and the church has moved from ordinary time to a season of expectation as we get ready to celebrate the birth of Christ. You will notice many new sights, sounds, colors, and themes in our worship over the coming weeks. As we build toward Christmas, we will hear words from the prophets, Jesus himself, John the Baptist, and Mary, the mother of Jesus. During each of the 4 weeks of Advent we will also have themes that can help guide us spiritually and devotionally. On December 1st we will focus on *Hope* as we consider some signs that Jesus pointed to for his future return. On December 8th we will reflect on the theme of *Peace* as we encounter John the Baptist and his message. On December 15th we will encounter *Joy* as we experience the Choir's Christmas Cantata, and finally on the morning of December 22nd we will center ourselves on *Love* as we revisit Mary's Magnificat.

Each worship week in Advent will build upon the previous week and will culminate in the celebration of the Nativity of our Lord and Savior on Christmas Eve. Our service of candlelight and communion on December 24th promises to be a beautiful, rich, and meaningful service of worship, and we hope that you will join us.

During this next month my hope as your pastor is that you would carve away some time to center yourselves on your relationship with Jesus Christ and to rest. This season of the year can be incredibly enriching in many ways, but it is also a time that can pull us in more directions than we are used to. I pray that you would find time for simplicity, for prayer, for celebration, for fellowship with family and friends, and for communion with God. I hope that as we worship together, you can find some of the hope, peace, joy, and love that God wants for us, and for our relationships with others. During this month I also hope you will take time to say "yes" to some new ways to help others, and "no" to things that don't. I also hope you will find some ways to become more connected to our unique community of faith and to share your faith with others. I look forward to seeing you around the church.


