

From the Pastor's Study...

"Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to God, just as he had done before." -Daniel 6:10

August is upon us, and I must admit that I am excited about it. Personally, I am excited because we have celebrated several milestones in our family over the course of the last several weeks. Our oldest daughter Sydney has stepped into the new world of being a 3rd grader and will be an 8 year old this month. Molly is growing up faster and faster, and just started doing gymnastics with her sister! I celebrated my 39th year around the sun, and Julie and I had our 13 year anniversary. The months of July/August have naturally become a festive and celebratory time for our family and a season of milestones.

I know that many of us "celebrate" during this time of year because August marks the beginning of something new. Educators, students and parents often use August to mark a rite of passage to the next school grade, or the next group of students. Some among us may be starting a new job or career or beginning University classes. Some of us may even recognize that August kicks off the downhill slide to the festive season of fall.

Just as August often provides milestones to recognize, it also inevitably provides the opportunity to fully get back in the swing of things after summer. This means fulfilling responsibilities for loved ones and friends, like doctors' visits, attending games, running errands, and getting folks to and from school, or practices. No matter your age, August promises to have a more complex schedule with more responsibility. It is a fun but equally busy time.

As we shift into a busier season I want to invite all of you to strive to carve away some time for something simple. I want to invite you to try to talk with God everyday. An ancient Old Testament prayer practice that Jesus would have participated in was to pray three times a day: Morning, Noon and Evening. As the authors of Common Prayer: A Liturgy for Ordinary Radicals say, "The daily cycle of prayer-morning, midday and evening-is like a heartbeat for the global church, passing from one time zone to the next each day, so that we as a people can, as the apostle Paul taught us, pray without ceasing."

As we move into August with all its natural complexities and milestones, I want to invite you to give yourself the gift of striving to pray as Daniel does. I want to invite you to check in with God three times a day. This could mean praying for others, praying through the Psalms, offering the Lord's Prayer, doing an Upper Room Devotional, or even using a breviary. (A <u>breviary</u> is a book for guided prayer. Some great ones that I have used in the past are: Guide to Prayer by Upper Room Books, The Divine Hours by Phyllis Tickle, The Book of Common Prayer, Common Prayer for Ordinary Radicals and Christian Prayer: The Liturgy of the Hours.)

May we allow daily prayer to simply nourish our hearts, minds, and bodies even as things promise to get busier as fall approaches. I hope that you will find ways to cultivate this simple practice in your own devotional life this month.

Thessaloniki. Chris will discuss many themes that you can apply to your faith life today. Please make plans to join us in worship for all five weeks of this unique series!





Some Thoughts on Giving from Marlee Tierce

The tithe is the Lord's way of asking us to show our love. Giving God a percentage of our earnings shows that we put our love for Him before our need for money. Costs have gone up. Living in 2025 takes money. Budgeting our finances helps keep us on track and shows us where the money is going.

Where is the church in your budget? Do you decide what to give to the church based on the cost of groceries that week? Do you decide what to give to the church when the offering plate is passed?

Or do you give to the church prayerfully as support for the Lord's work?

Supporting a fruitful church takes money.

On the back of each week's bulletin is a financial highlight that shows:

- **General Giving** is the total each Sunday of what was donated to the general fund. As Regina Warfel explained in last month's newsletter, this money goes to pay bills such as utilities, printing, office supplies, subscriptions (i.e. Upper Room), salaries and church upkeep.
- **Designated Giving** donations go to a specific budget item such as Community Café, Community Assistance, Youth, Music ministries, Budget Reserve, etc. It can only be used for the designated budget line. If a donation is not designated, it is used to pay the general bills of the church and to pay the 10% tithe to the Holston Conference.
- **Needed Monthly** shows how much is required to pay for the bills. That means that if we meet that total in our donations, we can meet all of the church's known financial obligations.
- **Total Giving for the month** shows us the amount that has been donated toward covering all of the necessary obligations and allows us to see if we have enough to pay the bills that month

The folks who report on our giving and guide our budget decisions are the Finance Committee. {This group is composed of chair people from Trustees, Lay Representative, Lay Representative to the Annual Conference, Staff Parish Relations, and Church Council, those elected for a 1 year at-large term, the Church Treasurer, the Finance Committee Chair, the Finance Committee Secretary/Treasurer and the Pastor. The Finance Committee meets the second Tuesday of each month at 6:00PM opening with prayer before the business. This is not a closed meeting, anyone is welcome to attend or ask questions.}

In a quote from pastor/author Dr. R. B. Ouelette, "To not tithe and then ask God to bless your finances is like stealing from your boss and asking for a raise."

The Lord works miracles. He uses our gifts to multiply what he can do to change lives, to provide peace and comfort, to give people fellowship with each other, to add to our numbers and to allow our church to flourish with His love.

What miracles would you like to see in the growth of our church? What services, what missions, who could we reach that we have only dreamed possible. Dare to dream and participate with your prayers, your presence, your witness, your gifts and your service and watch what the Lord can do.

Prayerfully give to the General Fund to provide the necessary amount needed to pay the bills and have enough for fulfilling dreams. Ask a Trustee or a Finance Committee member about projects that need funding. Let someone know about a vision for the church you would like to see us reach.

Earn all you can, save all you can, and give all you can are the three basic points of John Wesley's famous sermon entitled, "The Use of Money." Wesley made note in 1789 that "If Methodists would give all they can, then all would have enough."
