Even when tragedy hits, the work of the church and the work of this office can't be put on hold. I appreciate how Cheryl and Carol kept things moving. In going through a tragedy, however great or small, family support is naturally present and necessary. Support from fellow colleagues is not as expected, so when the outpouring of love is shown through the people you work with, it adds an additional blanket around a mending heart.

Now, I know, we are more than simply colleagues and co-workers. We are in ministry together. We work as one to usher in the grace and love of Jesus Christ. We work together to promote justice for the oppressed, freedom for the enslaved, and salvation for the lost. Though we share in various differences, we have a common denominator that trumps any differences of opinion we may have. That very common denominator, Christ Jesus, is what connects us.

I have always believed in the United Methodist connection. Even as a child I would listen to my friends tell sad stories that revolved around the firing of their pastor and how their family of faith had been absent of a spiritual leader for months, sometimes years. It was very unknown and foreign to me even to a point where I couldn't wrap my mind around it. But as I have grown and matured and moved through my own ministry the connection began to be much more than simply churches always having a pastoral leader. And now that I am moving through the most tragic event of my life the connection has become greater that it was before.

Even in having a greater appreciation of the connection it was still quite institutional to me. Which is very much appealing to my analytical mind. But there is no pattern of behavior when it comes to expressing love, grace, and compassion. There are steps to follow in making sure a church always has a pastor. There are no steps to work through in descending into a dark hole to be with your fellow pastor, colleague, and friend.

It gives me great encouragement as I look ahead to the work we have before us. Work that will sometimes involve a process but at other times not. Work that will usher us into a new chapter of our conference while continuing to usher in the grace and love of Christ. Work that will require our connection in every sense of the word. A connection I know is there not only because I see it in our church, but, more importantly, I've felt it in my heart.
