From the Pastor's Study:

April is here! I can't believe that springtime is already well underway. I am so excited about having the opportunity to experience my second Easter season with you all as your Pastor here at 1st UMC. As we enter into this new month, the 40 day season of Lent came to an end with Palm Sunday worship on April 2nd. We then entered Holy Week, which is one of the most sacred seasons in the church year. This is a time where we will inten-



tionally seek to contemplate the days leading up to the passion and death of our Lord. It is a week meant for prayer, fellowship, scripture meditation, and participation in the story of our Savior. Below is a schedule of all the ways we are planning to move through Holy Week, as a community.

One way that you can be more devotionally centered during Holy Week is to pray the Psalms. (Here are a few great ones to start with: Psalm 22, 1, 119, 23, 51, 31, 102, 118, etc.) The Psalms are the prayer book of the Bible, and the book that Jesus himself probably prayed from. My hope is that as we journey toward Easter together, and in the days after, the Psalms can help us to be rooted & grounded in scripture and in conversation with God. I hope and pray that you will find ways to participate in some (if not all) the things we have planned for you during this sacred week of the year.

Project for 2023

The Hiwassee District has begun the process of collecting Health Kits which will go to benefit folks in Liberia. Throughout the month of April a box will be available in the gathering area labeled "Health Kits for Liberia." This is part of broader Holston Conference effort to annually provide Health, Education, and Food resources to the people of Liberia and Zimbabwe. The Hiwassee district goal is 400 kits, and we would love for 1st UMC of Madisonville to collect at least 50 health kits this year.

Here are the instructions to make one:

Pack these items in a 2-gallon Zip-Loc bag:

\$5.00 for shipping** 1 hand towel 1 washcloth 2 toothbrushes 2 tubes toothpaste (6.4. oz. or less) 1 bottle shampoo (15 oz. or less) 1 bottle lotion (18 oz. or less) 1 bottle roll-on deodorant (4 oz. or less) 1 small spray perfume/cologne/body mist (4 oz. or less)

Pack these separately in sandwich-size Zip-Loc bag— please do NOT put in larger 2-gallon bag:

1 tube antibacterial ointment (1 oz.) 1 bottle Tylenol/acetaminophen 500mg (24 ct.)

**Please include \$ 5.00 per kit to cover the shipping costs to Africa. Please put the money/check for your kits in a separate envelope — do not put money in the Zip-Loc container itself.

Hiwassee District Hands-On Mission Knoxville, TN pm Saturday, April 22, 2023 starting at 10:00 am EDT. Clergy and laity who were voting members at the June 2022 Annual conference The purpose of the called Special Session of the Annual Conference will be to process qualified requests for disaffiliation under ¶ 2553 of the United Methodist Book of Discipline (BOD).. In addition to this special session, a revised Disaffiliation Packet will be made available that will address some of the logistical and practical issues that had been expressed about the disaffiliation process.

> Please note, that although the disaffiliation date is earlier, churches will still have the same length of time for the submission of disaffiliation materials as before. The Holston Conference Affiliation/Disaffiliation Team is aware some churches may still be in the discernment process at the time of the called Special Session. A subsequent called Special Session of the Holston Annual Conference in the last quarter of 2023 will be considered for the purpose of processing qualifying requests for disaffiliation under ¶2553 if there are churches that are not able to complete the disaffiliation process prior to the April 22, 2023 Special Session. Please be in prayer for God's wisdom and guidance as we move together as sisters and brothers in the Body of Christ.


