The writer of Hebrews, after explaining that Jesus knew what it meant to deal with the daily struggles of life as we do, and to face every temptation we face, yet he did not sin, said: "Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with BOLDNESS, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)

TODAY is the day for you to begin to pray often—you can bring your requests and concerns to God with BOLDNESS, knowing that He is eager to hear what you have to pray about. Join the growing number of people who pray each day, and know God's presence in your life.

"Whoever welcomes a child . . .

Look What's Happening at FUMC!

The General Conference of The United Methodist Church, in April 1996, adopted a resolution aimed at reducing the risk of child sexual abuse in the church. The adopted resolution includes the following statement:

Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes a child ... welcomes me" (Matthew 18:5). Children are our present and our future, our hope, our teachers, our inspiration. They are full participants in the life of the church and in the realm of God.

Jesus also said, "If any of you put a stumbling

block before one of these little ones...it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth

of the sea" (Matthew 18:6). Our Christian faith calls us to offer both hospitality and protection to the little ones, the children. The Social Principles of The United Methodist Church states that "children must be protected from economic, physical, emotional and sexual exploitation and abuse (P 162C).

All this being said, First United Methodist Church Madisonville has a strong written safe sanctuary policy aimed at protecting our children, youth and vulnerable adults. It has been in place for several years and many of us have gone through a training session and signed off that we understand the policy and will uphold the policy.

Earlier this year I went through a Safe Sanctuary Policy training session given by the Hiwassee District. I can tell you this. Our policy is as strong and thorough as anyone's policy. We do need to do a refresher session and also include those who have not been through the training.

We will have a Safe Sanctuary Policy training session on Thursday August 15th at 6:30 PM in the fellowship hall. This will be a refresher

for those who have been trained and training for all others who are working with or plan to work with our children and

youth in any capacity. Also, we have been told that we told that we need to do another background check on everyone. The cost is \$15.00 per person.

We want to protect our children, youth, and vulnerable adults and we want to make sure that First United Methodist Church Madisonville is a safe place for all those who worship here. Please make plans to attend this training session.


<u>Ignite</u>

From the Finance Committee . . .

Your Finance Committee has been working diligently to be good stewards of the money you give to support the work of our church.

To meet the monthly budget for our General Fund that was approved by the Administrative Board we need \$20,304 each month. Over the first six months of 2019 we have received an average of \$18,062 per month for our budgeted needs.

Our Building Fund mortgage payment (in addition to our General Fund) requires a payment of \$4,034 each month. We have received an average of \$4,264 per month for the first six months. If we are to pay the mortgage off by 2024 (as we had hoped), we need an additional \$2,000 each month.

Please be in prayer for the financial condition of our church that we may continue in our mission "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" and to be the hands and feet of God in our community.


We have taken a summer break and now are looking forward to our fall activities. I look forward to seeing all of you and as we begin to set our plans in place.


