Thirty-three years ago, E. Stanley Jones, the great Christian (and Methodist) missionary to Asia, especially to India, suffered a stroke, at the age of 88. Not to be deterred by this setback, Jones, already the author of more than a dozen books, dictated his next (and last) book into a tape recorder: *The Divine Yes!* In this book, Jones taught that God is always God of the positive. Although human beings (including you and me) have "sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Romans 3: 23), God has made many promises to us over the centuries, and these promises have all been more than

season this year, we want to think about, as E. Stanley Jones had, the promises of God's love, forgiveness, and blessings that have been fulfilled in the coming of God's Son and our Savior, Jesus Christ. For Jesus truly is "God's YES!" to a troubled and needy world.

Our messages for December, then, will address the positive message God has given us in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. On December 1<sup>st</sup>, our message will be "GOD'S YES— In the Beginning!" On December 8<sup>th</sup>, we will briefly consider "GOD'S YES— In the FLESH!" On December 15<sup>th</sup>, we will look at "GOD'S YES— In our HEARTS!" On December 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Sunday before Christmas, the message will be "GOD'S YES— In our WORLD!" On December 24<sup>th</sup>, for our 6:00 PM Christmas Eve worship service, we will look at "GOD'S YES"— In Bethlehem and Beyond!" Also, look at the enclosed calendar for several other Christmas activities for children and youth in December. See you Sunday at the "God's Positive Message for You" place.



In March we will celebrate by leading a Saturday small group session with others to share what we've learned, enjoy a pot luck dinner and attend a service with a guest speaker on Praying during Lent. That same guest speaker will do the service on Sunday morning.
