From the Pastor's Study:

February is upon us! This means that we are entering a unique time in the life of the church. On the evening of February 22nd we will have a special evening worship service to recognize Ash Wednesday. This is traditionally a day set apart in the church year for penitence, spiritual reflection, and for new beginnings in the faith. Ash Wednesday also kicks off a 40-day season of the church that is called Lent. For some Christian traditions, this season has been used for new converts in the



faith to prepare for their baptism (on Easter) and full membership in their local church. Most Christian traditions who observe Lent use it as a time to work toward turning away from things that distract us from God and build spiritual practices and habits that can sustain us through the coming year. At its heart, Lent is a time for evangelism and for true conversion—a time for growing through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting, and being signs of God's kingdom in this world.

As your Pastor I want to invite you to give yourselves the gift of having a Lenten journey of your own this year. Traditionally it is popular to give something up during this season, like chocolate or junk food...But what I want to invite you to do is set aside some time to reflect on a few things that you could give up so that you could have a deeper relationship with God. This might mean giving up daily social media to read scripture or to pray, or it could mean carving time away from work to serve someone else, or to spend more intentional time with family. In Sunday worship throughout the season of Lent we will be highlighting different ways that you can deepen your relationship with God through personal devotion.

This focus on our devotional life will be coupled with some deep engagement with scripture both in worship and at our Wednesday morning Pastor's Bible Study. (See more details about this ongoing class inside this edition.)

However you decide to participate in Lent, I hope you will do so with intention and care in 2023. The deep joy and hope that we all wish to experience at Easter as we celebrate Christ's resurrection, begins right now. As we enter this new season I hope that we can continue to grow together as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Throughout this month and all of Lent I invite you to keep these verses from Psalm 130 before you: "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning. O Israel, hope in the Lord! For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with him is great power to redeem."

I pray that these words of scripture may guide us as we enter Lent, and eventually look toward Holy Week and Easter.

Sue's News - February 2023

Where did the month of January go? Didn't we just do our Christmas decorating a few days ago? Didn't the Christmas parade just pass by the church a Saturday or two ago? Didn't the choir just do our Christmas cantata a few Sundays ago instead of almost two months ago?

I am going to segue into worship service music and then into choir. I have talked about music and the part that it plays in the worship service before. I want to revisit the subject this month. I want you to think about the importance of music in worship. Think about our Sunday morning worship services. We are United Methodists and we are very methodical. We always have a prelude that signals the beginning of worship and the music sets the tone for us to calm down and really get into our worship time. We have a choral call to worship. We sing a hymn of praise. We sing the the Gloria Patri. We have a hymn of meditation after the prayer. We have special music during offering time which sometimes is the choir, a soloist, a small group or an instrumental special. We sing the Doxology. We have a closing hymn that reinforces Pastor Chris' sermon. We have a choral benediction and the service ends with a postlude. I think that if you go to a traditional service at almost any United Methodist church you would see this pattern. I am sure that if you go to a contemporary service it would be a different order. I don't get to do much Sunday morning visiting at other churches, but I remember that even on our mission trips to South Carolina the order of worship was almost identical to ours. You can see that music is a very important part of worship in United Methodist churches. Can you imagine a service without music?

Let me shift gears and get more specific. I want you to think about our choir (and possibly about being a part of our choir). The choir is a very faithful group that meets on Wednesday evenings (usually at 6 PM) in the sanctuary for

a one hour rehearsal. We work hard during that hour, but we also have a good time. Not everyone reads music, but everyone loves to sing. Not everyone is a soloist, but everyone loves to sing. Not everyone can be there every Wednesday night, but everyone loves to sing when they are there. Our commonality is that we love to

sing! And, I can truly say that we love each other and we love this church. We have a good time together. We share each other's concerns and joys. We are family.

Now, let me get even more specific. We have begun to work on our Easter cantata WHEN I SURVEY THE WONDROUS CROSS which we plan to present on the Sunday after Easter (April 23rd), and we would love for you to join the choir as we get ready for this special presentation. I have CDs that you can take home after choir practice and listen to as you learn the music. It is a beautiful cantata and we would love to have more voices in the choir. We would love to have you sing with us on Sunday mornings, too. Just let me know if you have any questions.

From the Church Office

Our apologies for the tardiness of this newsletter. This last month we have been busy building out our new accounting and payroll system in PowerChurch (our church management software). The entire first week of the month has been filled with the first end-of-month with the new software. Now that everything has calmed down, we anticipate getting back to a more normal schedule.

PowerChurch allows us to automate a great number of otherwise time consuming reporting functions and enhanced communications capabilities - some of which you may have already noticed!

Lent Begins this Month...but what is it?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. (The Saturday before Easter Sunday.) Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word lencten, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of selfexamination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming **Continues:** of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, Resurrection. (*This content comes from UMC.org*)

Ash Wednesday Worship & Family Night Supper, Feb. 22nd

Ash Wednesday is a unique day in the church year where we gather to mark the beginning of the 40 day season of Lent. Our worship together will be a time to put aside past sins and failures through repentance, and to kick off a period of time to foster new beginnings in our relationship with Jesus Christ. In worship will focus on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Christ.



While the use of ashas sign of mortality and penance may be new to some, has a significant history in both Jewish and

Christian worship. The imposition of ashes can be a powerful way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. We hope you will join us for a special service of worship this coming Wednesday evening at 7:00 p.m. in our sanctuary.

Before the service, at 6:00 PM, plan to join us in the Fellowship Hall for a light soup/sandwich dinner. Soup and bread will be provided, This will also be the dinner for the group. Please mark your calendars to join us!


