## RELIGION — or JESUS CHRIST?

A radio ad for a church caught a listener's attention:

"Because you've heard about Christianity, you might not be interested in religion. Well, it might surprise you—Jesus wasn't interested in religion either. But He was big on relationship and teaching us to love one another." It continued, "You may not like everything about our church, but we offer authentic relationship, and we're learning to love God and each other. You're welcome to visit."

Many people understand the term "religion" as a bunch of rules that make you look good to God and others, and they are not very interested in that kind of "religion." The ad had a good insight, in that Jesus had real problems with the religious leaders of his day, because they were committed to following a list of rules that they were convinced would satisfy and please God. He said the Pharisees, guided by tradition and rules but not by love for the Lord, "outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside [they] are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness" (Matt. 23:28). They didn't have the love of God in their hearts (John 5:42). Jesus wanted relationship with them, but they were "not willing to come to [Him]" (5:40).

It is true— Jesus was not very interested in following rules to look outwardly spiritual, to please God or other people. Jesus was interested in relationships— that each of us might have a personal relationship with God, and with Jesus the Risen Savior Himself. He offers a personal, intimate relationship with Himself to all who come to Him, and complete forgiveness and unconditional love and eternal life to everyone who trusts in Him. We are reading and preaching through the Parables of Jesus in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke this month, to see more of what Jesus taught about "Faith, that is MORE than religion".

**Lent** February 17 (Ash Wednesday) thru April 3

Here are some interesting facts about the Lenten season:

Lent is the period of 40 days before Easter in the Christian calendar. Sundays are not included in the count. It falls on a different date each year because it is dependent on the date of Easter Sunday.

Why 40 days? The number is significant in Jewish-Christian scripture: in Genesis, it took 40 days and nights of rain to cause a flood which destroyed the earth; the Hebrews spent 40 years in the wilderness before reaching the Promised Land; Moses fasted for 40 days before receiving the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai; Jesus spent 40 days of fasting in preparation for his ministry.

Lent is derived from an Old English word which means "lengthen." The last week of Lent is called Holy Week.

Violet is the symbolic color for Lent, with altars, statues and other religious paraphernalia veiled in violet fabric.

Why violet? The color is associated with mourning, which anticipates Christ's pain

and suffering on the cross; and royalty, which celebrates Christ's resurrection.

In most Christian denominations, Lent starts with Ash Wednesday, which is derived from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of the faithful as a sign of repentance to God. The ashes are made by burning the blessed palms that were distributed the previous year on Palm Sunday.

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline.

Through the service of ashes on the first day of Lent, we come before God recognizing our humanity, repenting of our sin, and remembering who we are and who we can be.




