## From the Pastor's Study:

February is upon us! This means that we are entering a unique time in the life of the church. On the evening of February 14th we will have a special evening worship service to recognize Ash Wednesday. This is traditionally a day set apart in the church year for penitence, spiritual reflection, and for new beginnings in the faith. Ash Wednesday also kicks off a 40-day season of the church that is called Lent. For some Christian traditions, this season has been used for new converts in the faith to prepare for their baptism (on Easter) and full membership in their local church. Most Christian traditions who observe Lent use it as a time to work toward turning away from things that distract us from God and build spiritual practices and habits that can sustain us through the coming year. At its heart, Lent is a time for evangelism and for true conversion—a time for growing through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting, and being signs of God's kingdom in this world.



As your Pastor I want to invite you to give yourselves the gift of having a Lenten journey of your own this year. Traditionally it is popular to give something up during this season, like chocolate or junk food...But what I want to invite you to do is set aside some time to reflect on a few things that you could give up so that you could have a deeper relationship with God. This might mean giving up daily social media to read scripture or to pray, or it could mean carving time away from work to serve someone else, or to spend more intentional time with family. In Sunday worship throughout the season of Lent we will be highlighting different ways that you can deepen your relationship with God through personal devotion.

This focus on our devotional life will be coupled with some deep engagement with scripture both in worship and at our Wednesday/Sunday morning Pastor's Bible Studies. (See more details about this ongoing class inside this edition.)

However you decide to participate in Lent, I hope you will do so with intention and care in 2024. The deep joy and hope that we all wish to experience at Easter as we celebrate Christ's resurrection, begins right now. As we enter this new season I hope that we can continue to grow together as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Throughout this month and all of Lent I invite you to keep these verses from Lamentations before you: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore I will hope in him' The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul that seeks him."

I pray that these words of scripture may guide us as we enter Lent, and eventually look toward Holy Week and Easter.

## Sue's News - February 2024

As I sit down to write my Sue's News column for the month, I sometimes go back and look at what I wrote about this time of the previous year. I looked back at last year, and I wrote about how music plays such an important part in our Sunday worship services. Last Sunday we did an old timey worship service where we did not have slides and we used our hymn book for many parts of the service. (Some of the hymn books probably needed a good dusting because they had not been picked up and used in a long time!) During children's time Chris had the children each grab a hymnal and look through it as he explained things that are found in our United Methodist Hymnal. The kids enjoyed the lesson and I think the whole congregation had a refresher course on what could be found in the hymnal.



About a year ago I wrote about church service music and about things that are happening in the choir. I think I will revisit that theme again this month. I want you to first imagine a worship service without music. We would have words of invitation, affirmation, confession, prayer, a children's moment, scripture, sermon, benediction and other spoken or read things. All of these are very important times in our worship service, but think about how music helps to tie all of these things together. Think about our Sunday morning worship service. We are United Methodists and we are very methodical. We always have a prelude that signals the beginning of worship and the music sets the tone for us to calm down and really get into our worship time. We have the trinity chimes sounded with our handbells. We have a choral call to worship. We sing a hymn of praise. We sing the the Gloria Patri. We have a hymn of meditation and rejoicing after the prayer. We have special music during offering time which sometimes is the choir, a soloist, a small group or an instrumental special. We sing the Doxology. We have a closing hymn that reinforces Pastor Chris'

sermon. We have a choral benediction, ring the chimes and the service ends with a postlude. I think that if you go to a traditional service at almost any United Methodist church you will see this pattern. I am sure that if you go to a contemporary service it would be a different order. I don't get to do much Sunday morning visiting at other churches, but I remember that even on our mission trips to South Carolina the order of worship was almost identical to ours. If you watch another United Methodist worship service online, you will see a similar pattern. You can see that music is a very important part of worship in United Methodist churches. Can you imagine a service without music?

I want to shift gears and get more specific. I want you to think about our choir (and possibly about being a part of our choir). The choir is a very faithful group that meets on Wednesday evenings (usually at 6 PM) in the sanctuary for a one hour rehearsal. We work hard during that hour, but we also have a good time. Not everyone reads music, but everyone loves to sing. Not everyone is a soloist, but everyone loves to sing. Not everyone can be there every Wednesday night, but everyone loves to sing when they are there. Our commonality is that we love to sing! And, I can truly say that we love each other and we love this church. We have a good time together. We share each other's concerns and joys. We are family.

Now, let me get even more specific. We have begun to work on our Easter cantata AMAZING LOVE which we plan to present on the second Sunday after Easter (April 14th), and we would love for you to join the choir as we get ready for this special presentation. I have CDs that you can take home after choir practice and listen to as you learn the music. It is a beautiful cantata and we would love to have more voices in the choir. We would love to have you sing with us on Sunday mornings, too. Just let me know if you have any questions. See you this coming Sunday in morning worship where we will have plenty of beautiful music!

## Read Together for February

This year Rev. Chris Black invites you to join him in participating in the Holston Conference's "Read Together" initiative. This opportunity challenges us to read through the whole Bible in one year. In 2024, we will be reading the Bible chronologically using a path laid out in J. Ellsworth Kalas's "The Grand Sweep: 365 Days from Genesis through Revelation." This reading plan asks us to read only 2-3 chapters a day which will be much less burdensome than previous years studies.



Participating in this initiative as a whole congregation can uniquely bind us together as Christ's disciples all while rooting us more deeply in God's word. Even if you didn't read every assigned readings in January you are welcome to jump back in! There are schedules available in the welcome center with each month's readings. ## "Lent Begins this Month...but what is it really? "

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. (The Saturday before Easter Sunday). Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending themselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

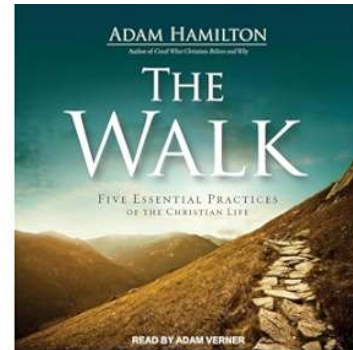

Bible study class on Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. in our Sanctuary. However, Chris will also be hosting a class on Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary. At both the Wednesday morning and Sunday morning classes Pastor Chris will be offering a study on Adam Hamilton's book called the "The Walk: 5 Essential Practices of the Christian Life."

Here is the description of the book:

How do we walk with Christ—daily follow him, grow in him, and faithfully serve him? In the Gospels, Jesus modeled for us the Christian spiritual life. The apostles taught it in their writings. And the Church has, through the last 2,000 years, sought to pursue this Christian spiritual life.

In "The Walk", Adam Hamilton focuses on five essential spiritual practices that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. Each of "these practices is intended as part of our daily walk with Christ while also being an essential part of growing together in the church".

In each chapter, Hamilton explores one of these practices, its New Testament foundation, and what it looks like to pursue this practice daily in our personal life and together in the life of the church. 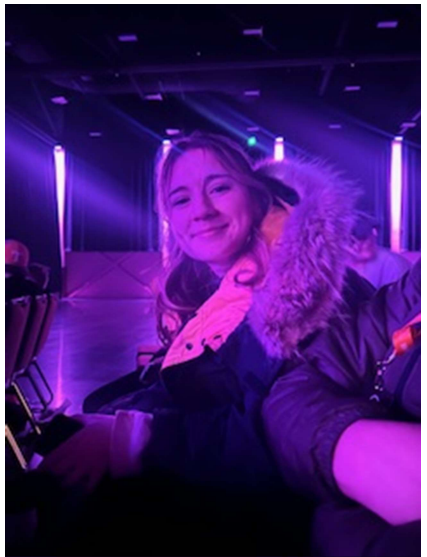

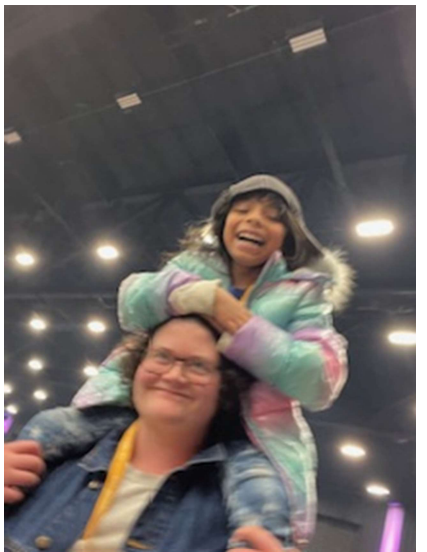
