

Max Lucado's People of the Bible Studies

These two studies will get us through winter and into summer with breaks for holidays and meetings. These are not studies for just women or just men. We can all learn from the studies of how God intervened to change lives to impact the world. Each chapter is about a different person.

- 1. <u>Ten Women of the Bible:</u> For women in Bible times being overlooked, marginalized, having your contributions discounted because you're a woman...it's just the way things were. In this 10-lesson workbook, Max Lucado tells some of his favorite accounts of women in Scripture and the remarkable way God broke down cultural barriers to use them in the unfolding of His story.
- 2. <u>Ten Men of the Bible:</u> The men depicted in the Bible were not perfect by any means. We find story after story marked by scandal, failure, and intrigue. Yet we also find many stories of men who were able to look beyond their circumstances, completely trust in the Lord and

follow Him wherever He chose for them. Like us, these men made both good and bad decisions along the way--and experienced both good and bad consequences--and we find our struggles and hopes in the pages of the Bible that tells their stories.

Community Assistance Fund (CAF) Report

December—and its weather—has made heavy demands on the Community Assistance fund. Since we restarted the Pastor's Community Assistance Fund before Easter this year, we have been very active. We have provided gift cards from businesses that do not sell alcohol or to-bacco, and we otherwise make payments by credit card or check directly to landlords or service providers - not to the CAF clients themselves, and we do not make payments to hotels or motels.



The Community Assistance Fund has received \$4,333 in donations this year/\$365 in December, and has to date made a total of \$3,670 this year/\$1,037 in December in disbursements to those in need. We have gift cards for food and gas from Subway, McDonalds, Walgreen's and United Grocery Outlet (UGO) to have available in the office when people show up with immediate needs for food, gas or other items. This month, we got many more calls for assistance to pay with electrical utilities.

Additionally, every week we get calls out of the blue from people with specific needs, and have been able to help them. The price of gas has prompted a number of calls for assistance, and we are seeing an uptick in calls from the elderly and families with as children asking for assistance with medical bills and prescriptions, utilities, and housing needs. While we cannot fill all of those needs, your generosity makes it possible for us to be able to immediately say "yes" to people in need, and to be Christ's hands and feet every day.
