New Opportunities for Dialogue

In anticipation of the United Methodist Church's General Conference beginning on April 23rd, 2024, our congregation will enter a season of intentional dialogue that will extend from August 2023 until after our denomination's General Conference meeting. This will be a time of prayer, exploration, discernment, study, sharing, and discussion. Rev. Chris Black will be hosting several events and opportunities for shared dialogue around issues that he anticipates will come up at the next General Conference. All of the upcoming events will be informative in nature, but will also encourage discussion from all participants.

Beginning in September, Rev. Chris Black will offer a six week class called "Conversations," which will focus on the divisions that are currently present in the United Methodist Church. Each week the class will put prominent conservative and progressive voices from within and outside the UMC in dialogue with each other. The hope is that these conversations will naturally create opportunities for dialogue amongst our own community members.

Can you believe it?! We are just officially a few days into summer, but it seems like summer is almost gone. It won't be that long until the kids start back to school here. WOW! BUT! THERE IS STILL LOTS TO ACCOMPLISH THIS SUMMER!

Our big July event will be our community Bible School when we will again join with Madisonville Presbyterian Church beginning on Sunday July 9th and ending at Sweetwater city pool on Thursday evening July 13. We could not get the pool the last Friday of Bible School as we have done for many years so we are going with a 4 day class week and end at the pool on Thursday night. The pool party has become a favorite tradition over the years and we all look forward to that evening. Please plan to join us for our exciting Bible School—Hero Hotline. We will have classes for all ages including adults. Our food folks are planning great meals. Kathleen Cornett is leading our meal group, and she said that individual bags of chips, watermelons, cantaloupes and any kind of garden produce will be greatly appreciated. Everything is coming together for a great Bible School week!

Not long after Christmas last year, I ordered this year's Christmas cantata. I am so excited about this cantata. It has taken all my will power not to start working on it, but we will soon! We would love to have people join us in the choir. Think about it, please. We meet at 6 PM on Wednesday evenings in the sanctuary for practice.

Even though it is summer time and things have slowed down a little bit for a short time, I am

amazed at how much outreach our church has been doing over the last few months and will continue to do in July. We put together 90 health kits for Holston Conference. Right now we have taken the names of 25 children who will get a back to school outfit and a pair of shoes through The Good Shepherd Center's Christmas in July project. Thanks to Regina Warfel who has coordinated this effort for our church and is going to volunteer at Good Shepherd Center to check incoming backpacks. Several of our members volunteer on a weekly basis at Good Shepherd Center year round. We had four of our folks go on a mission trip to Guatemala. The Passion Sisters have made several fidget blankets to distribute to people with dementia. We also have volunteers for the Isaiah 117 House. We have provided snacks for the late afternoon bus kids. We have collected and distributed baby diapers. We have done suppers for the Community Café. We have served needy people through our Blessing Box and our Community Assistance Fund. We have sent our folks on a mission trip to West Virginia. We gave a monetary gift to the Conference's Change for Children project and money for another mission project. The United Methodist Men and the Women in Faith will be giving out scholarships and graduation gifts in July. The Women in Faith gave a partial scholarship to one of our children who will be going to Camp Lookout in July. We call our Bible School a community Bible School and hope to have unchurched children attend our Bible School. I am sure I am leaving some things out.

three times each day to give him updates on our progress on the shed and that we painted his carport

and fence as well. (You can read the letter from Bear's nephew as well!) Not only did we work on Roger and Nahoma's home but we also played with their grandchildren and showed them we love and care for them. Their



handwritten letter to us is beautiful! We hope the people of Bishop know they are not forgotten, and





A Note of Thanks from One of the Families Helped By Our Mission Trip

From Christopher Callahan for Glenn "Bear" Marshall

Good Day First United Methodist Mission Service Team that helped in Bishop Virginia, I am the Nephew of 73 year old Glenn "Bear" Marshall for whom the team repaired and painted the gar-



age, carport and fence white. The Marshall family has lived in this property for over 50 years, and for the last couple decades this once vibrate community full of hard working people from coal miners to state workers took pride in their community, which has been ravaged by the opioid and meth drug epidemic. As hard working people started passing or moving out, the drugs moved in. Many houses in Bishop have been stripped of metals, sold, or burnt down. Even the police do not want to respond to calls for help. Through all this the resilience of the people have endured these hard times.

Bear has seen the good times pass with the boom of the mines where his father worked for decades before his retirement. Bear has endured the loss of his mother, father and 80 year old brother Porky, whom he lost after living his whole life with him over 50 years together in this little white house that shines like a beacon down in these beautiful mountains of the Appalachia. Bear did not graduate high school and has not worked much of his adult life, he has the mind and spirit of a young child and has been dependent on his parents and brother all these decades. He did not drive for over two decades because of cataracts on both eyes, he has one eye repaired a little over a year ago that allows him to drive into town to get his medicine and groceries. So God is moving in him each and every day.

He is old school and stubborn and went without TV for a few years until after his brother passed this last year. They have the TV still from 30 years ago. That generation makes things last. He has a mind like the rain man where he will spout out dates and numbers like it happened yesterday. He has lived and stood the watch in Bishop for over 5 decades but as the good Ole boys age they fade like stars in the sky. This meant the world to Bear he talked about the 17 beautiful souls that came this past week to give him hope on allowing him to continue to stand his watch as you enter into Bishop, VA. He does not leave the house unless he really has too and does not go to



church but understand your team's kindness, hard work and generosity gave him a glimpse into God's beautiful plan for us all.

As Bear stands watch over Bishop and continues to endure, his cousin Melvern watches over him. My mother Eva (76) married and departed from that house when she was 27 and she took us back there every summer as kids so our memories are deep and fond of this little community on the edge of cell services, still enduring and surviving. With grateful hearts from one Christian to another you touched the heart of one big Ole Bear in Bishop, VA! Thank you, and God Blessings from Seattle, WA, the nephew of Bear.

dows in the sanctuary.


Therefore, stage 1 and stage 2 stained glass project in currently under construction. These 4 windows should be installed before the end of July.


