From the Pastor's desk . . .

June is upon us and I can't help but be excited about it! It is now the "hot time" of the year, as Sydney calls it. I know many of us have trips planned to be with family or friends, or just to travel. For some of us (especially those in education or our youth), June is the beginning of a season where we catch our breath to get ready for the fall. For those among us in agriculture or farming, it is the complete opposite. This is one of the busiest times of the year for them as hay continues to be put up, livestock is cared for in the heat, and crops are tended to.



As a Pastor, June has traditionally been a month of spiritual rest/renewal for me. I usually take time to reflect on the previous year's ministry, and then begin making long-range plans for the next year. This includes everything from preaching texts, classes, and even fun ministry programming. June is also traditionally the time for all the Holston Conference clergy and laity to come together to meet as an Annual Conference. This is a time where church business is done, but it is also a time of fellowship, renewal, retreat, and inspiration for mission. I hope you will be in prayer for all of us who will gather during the first week of June at Lake Junaluska for the 2022 Annual Conference.

I also hope that you will find time this month to rest and be in retreat like I will be. For some of you, this will come naturally. For others of you it might sound impossible because of all that needs to be done. Still, we are called to find a time for Sabbath rest just as God did in the story of creation. As I considered this, I came across an article by the Rev. Bruce Gaultiere who was reflecting on a book by Eugene Peterson that talked about the importance of the Sabbath. He says, "Inspired by the Holy Spirit, I began setting aside large blocks of time for Sabbath Rest. Over some years, I grew into the practice of keeping a regular sabbath day to pray and play. A day of rest. A day to humble me with the reminder of my limitations. A day to slow my pace and cease my drive to produce. A day to find my identity outside of what I accomplish. A day to find enjoyment not in what I use, but simply in being myself with

Sue's News—June 2022



It's beginning to feel a lot like summer! I look out my office window and see the little children at the daycare playing outside in the warm sunshine. You don't have to plan your travel about town

around the time school begins and ends for the day. Flowers and gardens are blooming. Everything is green. Summer does not officially begin for almost 3 weeks, but it definitely feels like summer.

June will be an exciting month for our church. The first Sunday of June (June 5) is the date of Pentecost this year. Pentecost literally means 50. Pentecost is a moving date from year to year because it is always celebrated on the 50th day from Easter Sunday. Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirt upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. After receiving the power and gifts of the Holy Spirit, the Apostles immediately went out and preached Jesus' message to everyone—even those who spoke other languages. Pentecost is the birthday of the church, and the symbols of Pentecost are wind, fire, and a dove. The color red is associated with Pentecost. Let's all plan to wear red on Pentecost Sunday!

Another big event that takes place in June is the annual meeting of the Holston Conference that takes place at Lake Junaluska this year on June 5-8. This will be the first time Conference has been held in total as a group since June 2019 (before Covid changed everything). This will be a very exciting time. We have a new Bishop presiding. Old friendships

will be rekindled. Lots of decisions will be made. I was a Hiwassee District delegate in 2019 and had a wonderful experience. This year we have three folks attending—Pastor Chris, Marlee Tierce (our church delegate), and Richard Beaubien (Hiwassee District delegate). Please say a special prayer for these folks and for the 2022 Holston Annual Conference.

Another special happening for our church is reviving our annual summer mission trip for our youth and others. Again, 2019 was the last time we were able to send out a team to do mission work. This year up to 25 of our folks will be going to Kentucky June 19-25 to do mission work in one of the areas (close to Paducah, KY) that suffered lots of tornado damage. Mission trips are time of hard work, fellowship and fun for our youth and others making the trip. I have been on 5 of these mission trips, and each one was a different experience that I'll never forget. You eat meals together, sleep in tight places (many times on the floor on air mattresses), and worship together. You make new friends. Sometimes you even take outdoor showers! Going on a mission trip is a life changing experience. Pray for our 2022 team.

Make sure you have the dates for our 2022 Bible School (July 17-22) on your calendar. We will again be joining with Madisonville Presbyterian Church to sponsor a community Bible School. We will have more information soon.

Take time to have fun in June but remember that we will have lots going on here at the church during June and we want you to be a part of it. If you visit a church while you are on vacation, pick up an extra bulletin/newsletter and bring it to me. It is always fun to see what is going on in other churches. Have a good June!


