#### From the Pastor's desk . . .

March is now upon us! This means that we are entering a unique time in the life of the church. On the evening of March 2nd we will have a special evening worship service to recognize Ash Wednesday. This is traditionally a day set apart in the church year for penitence, spiritual reflection, and for new beginnings in the faith. Ash Wednesday also kicks off a 40-day season of the church that is called Lent.



For some Christian traditions, this season has been used for new converts in the faith to prepare for their baptism (on Easter) and full membership in their local church. Most Christian traditions who observe Lent use it as a time to work toward turning away from things that distract us from God and build spiritual practices and habits that can sustain us through the coming year. At its heart, Lent is a time for evangelism and for true conversion-a time for growing through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting, and being signs of God's kingdom in this world.

As your Pastor I want to invite you to give yourselves the gift of having a Lenten journey of your own this year. Traditionally it is popular to give something up during this season, like chocolate or junk food...But what I want to invite you to do is set aside some time to reflect on a few things that you could give up so that you could have a deeper relationship with God. This might mean giving up daily social media to read scripture or to pray, or it could mean carving time away from work to serve someone else, or to spend more intentional time with family. In Sunday worship throughout this season I will be highlighting different ways that you could be involved in mission, service, and outreach within our local community. This focus on outreach will be coupled with some deep engagement with scripture in the next couple of months, which will happen during our Wednesday morning Pastor's Bible Study. (See more details about the class inside this edition.

However you decide to participate in Lent, I hope you will do so with intention and care this year. The deep joy and hope that we all wish to experience at Easter as we celebrate Christ's resurrection, begins right now.

As we enter this new season I hope that we can continue to grow together as disciples of Jesus Christ. As I write this article I have a passage of scripture from the book of Ephesians before me, "<sup>8</sup>For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God- 9not the result of works, so that no one may boast. <sup>10</sup>For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life." -Ephesians 2: 8-10

I pray that these verses of scripture may guide us as we enter Lent, and eventually look toward Holy Week and Easter.

# Ash Wednesday Dinner & Service this Week

Ash Wednesday - which falls this week on March 2, 2022, marks the beginning of the 40 day season of Lent. Worship on this

day emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sins before God within the community of faith. We will focus on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ.

While the use of ashes as a sign of mortality and penance may be new to some, it has a significant history in both Jewish and Christian worship. The imposition of ashes can be a powerful way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. We hope you will join us for a special service of worship this coming Wednesday evening at 6:45 p.m. in our sanctuary.

Before the service, at 6:00 PM, plan to join us in the Fellowship Hall for a light soup/sandwich dinner. Soup will be provided, so please plan on bringing along sandwiches, salads, breads, or desserts to share with the congregation. This will also be the dinner for the youth group.

# An Announcement from the Trustees Committee:

The trustees of First United Methodist Church are pleased to announce that our parsonage at 111 Philpott Street has been sold. As many of you know the sale of our parsonage was authorized by a vote of the Church Conference on July 18<sup>th</sup> 2021, and the trustees were designated by that body to oversee the selling process. The property sold for \$325,000. These funds paid off the remaining parsonage mortgage debt of \$70,835 and the commission on sales of \$10,835. It should be noted that Bill Howe, our sales agent, did not charge our Church a commission. Of the remaining amount, \$200,000 will be invested at the Holston Foundation for future clergy housing allowances and the remaining \$44,000 has been deposited into the church general fund.

There is much to report from the technological side of the church! Since the start of COVID, the First United Methodist Church of Madisonville has made quantum leaps from where we were to where we find ourselves technologically today.

Have you seen our website 1umcm.com re-

cently? The first and most obvious update is the looping video drone shot made by own First



UMCM Air Force Drone Captain Hunter Cavett. —it really makes our site shine, and we can ALL be proud of it. Look forward to more work from Hunter to be featured at 1umcm.com, and on our YouTube channel.

Also on 1umcm.com—near the bottom of the main page is an expanded calendar of events. Now with our new church database system, all of our First UMC events are auto-magically (that's a word I made up) synced along with state and national events and holidays with the calendar online. If you click on any event, an info box will pop up telling you the "who, what, where, why, and how" info you need to know for that event. Check out the entry for Ash Wednesday (for example). We are still fleshing out details for some events.


Did I mention the new church database? Well, it's not new; it's called "PowerChurch", and it the same system Bruce Christopher has been using for years to keep track of donations and tithes. In it, we can keep track of congregants contact information and attendance records.

PowerChurch will allow us to analyze better to help us to serve you better, and efficiently plan activities and events. We are still loading church data into it, so there is still much to do.

#### Church Technology (continued)



One of Power-Church's most powerful features is the communications module. We now have mass and oneto-one texting capabilities, so, if (for

example) the electricity were to go out on a Sunday morning, we could mass text all of you and let you know what our plans for worship service are before you leave home. The text would be coming from our main number at (423) 442-2471 so you can know to trust it. We can even target and send messages to specific groups of people, for example, the parents of anyone with a child between the ages of 8 and 12, are signed up for a youth activity. <u>We will</u> <u>also limit our mass texting to emergencies and</u> <u>very time-sensitive events</u>, leaving other communications to arrive by email and/or snail mail.

One problem we have though is that we don't have everyone's mobile phone number — and for that matter everyone's birthdates (with birth YEAR) or anniversary dates (again, with the YEAR), or emails. Please look forward to helping us out with upcoming data collection efforts for info that you are willing to share, so that we can get the most out of PowerChurch.

For those of you who actually prefer to communicate through texting, no problem! We have you covered. If you text the church phone number during business hours, one of us will see it instantly and can respond back to you individually via text. AND FOR THOSE WHO DO NOT want to receive text messages, you may "opt out" of future messages simply by replying with the word "STOP" or by letting me know.—in a manner similar to how you can opt-out of mass emails from the church The key to successfully communicating with you is to make sure we are sending information in the way that YOU want to receive it., whether that way is by texting on your smartphone, email, or written on a post card: we will adapt to the way YOU want to hear from the First United Methodist Church of Madisonville.
