#### From the Pastor's desk . . .

In mid March 2020 I received a call from our District Superintendent, Rev. Hugh Kilgore, asking me to serve as interim pastor at Spring City UMC until the end of the conference year. This would turn out to be my first experience with "online" worship. Other than meeting with family members to plan two funerals, I did not meet any of the congregation in person other than members of the Staff Parish Relations Committee and those on the worship planning team until mid June. This meant I had the privilege of leading "in house" worship there only twice. Even under these unusual circumstances it was still a blessing to serve the Spring City church. I thought it would be a one time experience.

Surprise! A few weeks ago our District Superintendent, Rev. Hugh Kilgore, called again. This time to ask about serving as interim here at First UMC Madisonville until the end of the conference year. I was not anticipating such an invitation but am glad to serve here just as I was at Spring City UMC.

Reba asked me to share some introductory comment about my life and ministry in this month's newsletter.

I was born on August 29 1949, in Radford, Virginia. I grew up and lived across the New River from Radford in Pulaski County. I was the middle child of Franklin and Virginia Hubble, having an older brother and a younger sister. I was educated in the Pulaski County School system, graduating from Dublin High School in 1967.

After high school I attended the New River Vocation Technical School taking the Machine Shop Operator training course. I was intending to become a machinist but it was during this year the call to ministry came. This meant a change in education plans.

I enrolled at Hiwassee College in 1968. Following graduation at Hiwassee I enrolled at Tennessee Wesleyan and later at Candler School of Theology at Emory University, graduating with the Master of Divinity degree in 1974.

While at TWC, there were two significant milestones other than my graduation. The first was meeting Margaret Reed, who would become my wife in 1973. The other was beginning to serve as a pastor in the United Methodist Church. In 1970 my first appointment was in Meigs County, the Oak Grove/Ten Mile circuit.

Margaret and I have been blessed with two sons, Daniel and Adam. Daniel lives in Athens and is employed by Mayfield Dairy. Adam lives in Knoxville and is employed by Cellular Sales.


