

From the Pastor's Study:

As we enter May, I am reminded of all the transitions that often take place during this month, especially for many of our youth & children. We will have graduations, and the end of another school year for teachers and administrators. Some of our parents will be making the shift toward summer childcare, and many young people will be starting summer jobs. Also, many will be going on trips to rest or will look to spend time outside with family and friends. May can be a fun time as we shift from the unpredictable weather of spring to the promise of warmer days in the summer. Devotionally, I always find myself in a season of transition now



that Easter/Lent are in the rearview mirror. So to center myself this month I am once again planning on re-reading Paul's epistle to the Romans, which begins this way:

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God— the gospel he promised beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures regarding his Son, who as to his earthly life was a descendant of David, and who through the Spirit of holiness was appointed the Son of God in power by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord. Through him we received grace and apostleship to call all the Gentiles to the obedience that comes from faith for his name's sake. And you also are among those Gentiles who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be his holy people: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

The English translation of these first verses of Paul's letter makes for a really long sentence! Did you notice that it takes a long time to get to that first period? In this text Paul opens one of his most theologically expansive letters with a powerful assertion. He proclaims that he is called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of Christ. He is explicitly clear about who he is in relation to Jesus Christ and the work that God is continuing to do through the good news of our Savior. Later he reminds the Romans, (and us many years later,) that we have a clear identity as well!

As disciples, we are called "to belong to Jesus Christ" alone. This means as Christians we are called to prioritize our own growth in God's "grace and apostleship" and to invite others into (or teach others about) this life of "obedience of faith." We can do this in many different ways. John Wesley encouraged his followers to intentionally utilize what he called "Means of Grace": things like prayer, searching the scriptures, worship, serving others, visiting the sick or imprisoned, and partaking of the sacraments. For Wesley, these were outward and inward practices that were meant to intentionally deepen one's love for God, and for others.

As we move into May and the summer months, I want to invite you to try to do one thing different to deepen your relationship with God, and to reach out to (or serve) others in faith. This could mean doing something like making time to pray at noon each day for the whole month, or even seeing how you could get involved with feeding the hungry here in Monroe County. Whatever it is, I hope you will be creative with how you express how you "belong to Jesus Christ."

Dental Clinic Day Provides Cleanings



The free dental clinic hosted in the FUMC Community Room by the United Women in Faith on April 15 was a big success! Dental cleanings were provided by appointment on that day by Tennessee Wesleyan's (TWU) Dental Hygiene stu-

dents and their mobile clinic under the direction of Dr. Randa Colbert. Local dentists Dr. Brakebill, Dr. Devine, and Dr. Austin Johnson provided onsite coverage throughout the day. Participants received free dental cleanings and exams, and referrals for further care at the Athens clinic location if needed.

Community health assessments for Monroe County have previously noted that access to dental care is one of the most significant health needs in the county and regular dental care can help to prevent chronic diseases. The TWU dental hygiene program was originally founded at Hiwassee College and moved to Tennessee Wesleyan when Hiwassee closed. The program leads to a bachelor's degree and is accredited by the American Dental Association. The Director of the TWU dental hygiene program is Dr. Randa Colbert, Ed.D., RDH who also supervises the free dental clinic.

Thanks to Dr. Colbert and her students for their time and work. We also give a special thank you to our local dentists who volunteered their time with their onsite support. Plans are underway to continue this partnership with the TWU Dental Hygiene program with a Fall Dental Care day!


Mark the Dates: Bridal Showers





Pastor's Community Assistance Fund Update

On Wednesday, April 17 this year, we had a visit late in the afternoon - a man, a woman, and a 4 year old girl. The man, who looked familiar, identified himself as "D" and told us he was here to "thank the church" for our assistance during some very dark days for his family. With a little checking in our PowerChurch records, the rest of the story came back to mind. "D" was the very first person who asked us for help when we started the Pastor's Community Assistance fund. Freshly laid Your \$8,707 in donations to the Pastor's Commuoff from his job, he visited us on May 5, 2022 in need of either gas to do his new DoorDash job, or diapers, as he only had enough money for one of those.

When asked which he needed more, his follows: quick answer was "diapers" - and we were off to Walgreens to purchase a few packages of size 4 diapers for \$51,32. Soon after, we were able to connect him with "Nurture the Next," a local charity for families, which was able to get his family even more diapers. "D" said that with his work for DoorDash, and that he thought that with pray- We currently have \$1,503 remaining in the Comers and perseverance he could make things work "D" since.

Fast forward two years later to the present day...

"D", his wife "A" and daughter "P" were once again on our doorstep, but this time, "P" had a gift for us - a cookie she wanted our pastor to have. "D" and "A" reported that "D" had found new employment in his field, that their income had stabilized to the point that they had just bought a new home north of town. "D" said that every time he passes by our church, he sends up a prayer of thanks for the kindness shown to his family.

What our church has done for the community
