

Charge Conference in November



Community Assistance Fund (CAF) Report

Since we restarted the Pastor's Community Assistance Fund before Easter this year, we have been very active. We have provided gift cards from businesses that do not sell alcohol or tobacco, and we otherwise make payments by credit card or check directly to landlords or service providers - not to the CAF clients themselves, and we do not make payments to hotels or motels.



The Community Assistance Fund has received \$3,668 in donations this year/\$235 in September, and has to date made a total of \$2,202 this year/\$479 in October in disbursements to those in need. We have gift cards for food and gas from Subway, McDonalds, Walgreen's and United Grocery Outlet (UGO) to have available in the office when people show up with immediate needs for food, gas or other items.

Additionally, every week we get calls out of the blue from people with specific needs, and have been able to help them. The price of gas has prompted a number of calls for assistance, and we are seeing an uptick in calls from the elderly and families with as children asking for assistance with medical bills and prescriptions, utilities, and housing needs. While we cannot fill all of those needs, your generosity makes it possible for us to be able to immediately say "yes" to people in need, and to be Christ's hands and feet every day.
