IMPROVING OUR DISCIPLINES

What makes up a true Christian? John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement that became the United Methodist Church of today, often preached and wrote on this issue. Most of all, Wesley thought that being dedicated to

God meant having Christian discipline to practice what the first disciples and apostles practiced. In his sermon, *The Scripture Way of Salvation*, he made this observation: "What good works are those, the practice of which you affirm to be necessary to becoming more holy? First, all works of piety: such as public prayer, family prayer, and praying in our closet; receiving the supper of the Lord; searching the Scriptures, by hearing, reading, meditating; and

such a measure of fasting or abstinence as our bodily health allows."

"When you pray \dots not "If you pray."

How has your Christian

walk been going? Wesley, as well as Martin Luther before him, and Augustine before him, and countless Christian leaders before them and since their times, have taught that the Christian life has certain habits that are very important for us to follow.

This week, why not work on your prayer life, and see if you can establish a time, in the early morning or late evening, when you can spend five or ten minutes praying? Try reading a copy of the *Upper Room* devotional guide, and use the daily prayer in that. Read the Bible verse and the devotion, also, to give you a background for the prayer. In Matthew 6, Jesus said, "When you pray...." He did not say, "If you pray...." For Jesus, prayer is not an optional activity in the Christian life. It is just something we do, often, as a natural part of life.

See you Sunday at the "place of Christian discipline".

There is only one weekday (Labor Day) and 3 Saturdays gether (and our youth plan to do a carwash off site on one of these Saturdays) that our church will not be in use either by us or a community group! If I were a betting person, I would bet you that very few churches in Madisonville or in this area can make this claim. What would our community be like if the outside organizations who use our facility ceased to exist because they had no place to meet? I think it would drastically change the climate of our community. Think about the scouting pro-

grams in our community. We have Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts who meet here on a weekly basis. These kids are learning how to be good citizens, how to be careful with our environment and learning how God and Country fit together. Our church has given boys the chance to become Eagle Scouts and a place to bring their family and friends for their ceremony. What if they had no place to meet?

The Monroe County Homeless Coalition meets in our fellowship hall one day a month and looks at ways to help the homeless and near homeless population in our area. We call them quite often if we have someone who comes in the office and asks for help. The services that they provide assist many people but they do not have a brick and mortar office to work from. We give them a place to come together and share information and make decisions.

TOPS (TAKE OFF POUNDS SENSIBLY) has met faithfully for as long as I can remember in our community room on Thursday afternoon. This groups helps each other maintain a healthier lifestyle and encourages other people to join them.

A very active AA group meets on a weekly basis at our church. This gives folks who are struggling with many issues a chance to get together and talk about issues.

We are the place where many of our community civic organizations do fundraisers that benefit our community. The Kiwanis Club of Madisonville just had a very successful spaghetti dinner in our fellowship hall and those funds will be used to benefit the children and youth of Monroe County. The Good Shepherd Center/Lions Club will be using our downstairs as a

place to offer free eye exams beginning on September 10th. I know of at least two more groups that will use our facility

in the next few months to raise funds for very good causes.

I really like the phrase "we doze but we don't close"! That is the way I feel about the people and facilities of First UMC Madisonville. Thanks for all that you do to keep First UMC alive in our community outside of our scheduled worship services.

This is just one of the many ways that we can share God's love with others.
