Read Together for April



This year Rev. Chris Black invites you to join him in participating in the Holston Conference's "Read Together" initiative. This opportunity challenges us to read through the whole Bible in one year. In 2024, we will be reading the Bible chronologically using a path laid out in J. Ellsworth Kalas's "The Grand Sweep: 365 Days from Genesis through Revelation". This reading plan asks us to read only 2-3 chapters a day which will be much less burdensome than previous years studies.

Participating in this initiative as a whole congregation can uniquely bind us together as Christ's disciples all while rooting us more deeply in God's word. Even if you didn't read every assigned readings in January, February, or March, you are welcome to jump back in! There are schedules available in the welcome center with each month's readings. TWU Dental Clinic Returns to FUMC on April 15

The FUMC United Women in Faith (UWF) will host the Tennessee Wesleyan University Dental Clinic again on April 15 from 10 am to 2 pm to provide dental cleaning to participants who attend the dental clinic. If you would like to donate small bottles of mouthwash, please put them in the bin labeled

UWF in the Gathering Area.

This dental clinic will include dental cleanings and referrals as needed. Services provided at the dental care clinic are free to participants. Monroe County community health assessments have previously noted that access to dental care is one of the most significant health needs in the county and regular dental care can be associated with preventing other chronic diseases. The TWU dental hygiene program was originally founded at Hiwassee College and moved to Tennessee Wesleyan University when Hiwassee closed. The program leads to a bachelor's degree and is accredited by the American Dental Association. The Director of the TWU dental hygiene program is Dr. Randa Colbert, Ed.D., RDH, who also supervises the free dental clinic.

The Madisonville UWF hopes to continue this partnership with the TWU Dental Hygiene program and thanks Dr. Colbert and her students for

Hiwassee District Hands-On Mission Project for 2024

The Hiwassee District has once again begun the process of collecting Health Kits which will go to benefit folks in Liberia. Throughout the month of April a box will be available in the gathering area labeled "Health Kits for Liberia." This is part of a broader Holston Conference effort to annually provide Health, Education, and Food resources to the people of Liberia and Zimbabwe. The Hiwassee District goal is 400 kits, and we would love for 1st UMC of Madisonville to collect at least **50 health kits** this year.



Here are the instructions to make one:
Pack these items in a 2-gallon Zip-Loc bag:
\$5.00 for shipping**

- 1 hand towel
 - 1 washcloth
 - 2 toothbrushes
 - 2 tubes toothpaste (6.4. oz. or less) 1 bottle shampoo (15 oz. or less)
 - 1 bottle lotion (18 oz. or less)
 - 1 bottle roll-on deodorant (4 oz. or less)
 - 1 small spray perfume/cologne/body mist (4 oz. or less)
- Pack these separately in sandwich-size Zip-Loc bag— please do NOT put in larger 2-gallon bag: 1 tube antibacterial ointment (1 oz.)

1 bottle Tylenol/acetaminophen 500mg (24 ct.)

**Please include \$ 5.00 per kit to cover the shipping costs to Africa. Please put the money/check for your kits in a separate envelope — do not put money in the Zip-Loc container itself.

Please pay close attention to the specified size of each item!

General Conference begins this month on April 23rd

It was wonderful to be able to join in prayer together, and to hear directly from some of the delegates both in person, and via video. The group gathered at 1st UMC Maryville also had the opportunity to ask our delegates questions and to give them feedback. As I encouraged in my cover letter for this edition of The Flame, I hope you will join me in praying for our delegates as we move through this upcoming General Conference experience. Notes from the Preconference Briefing for the General Conference

The Preconference Briefing for the General Conference was enlightening and informative. There were three delegates present to answer questions and provide insight. The meeting began and ended with prayer. The video of Bishop Wallace-Padgett and delegates explained the logistics of the legislative General Conference and the roles of the delegates. Holston conference elected twelve delegates: six clergy, six laity and alternates. The petitions, resolutions and delegates were ready for the 2020 General Conference, but with the pandemic, all was postponed until 2024. This is not a new order of business.

Some of the main topics for debate are: reaffiliation requests from churches who disaffiliated, regionalization plans, and revision of the Social Principles to provide a more global understanding with less focus on the voice and issues of the United States. Over 95% of the petitions do not deal with sexual immorality or gender issues. Those petitions on both sides of these issues originated from the United States and Denmark (3 of those submitted).

Please pray for these delegates because this 10-day marathon of worship, debate, committees, and voting is intense, exhausting, and will take energy for delegates to constantly listen, read, study, pray, and worship as they make decisions. Delegates are not representatives of a church or conference and are bound only by conscience. They make decisions based on their prior research, discussions in committee, debates from the floor, knowledge of scriptures and prayer.

All 1099 petitions were sorted and assigned to specific committees. In researching, scanning, skimming and collecting data I am overwhelmed by the enormity of the tasks before these delegates from all over the world gathering in Charlotte. I see this conference in light of my attendance to Annual conferences that follow the same Rules of Order and legislative process. Please contact me with any questions about petitions, resolutions, committee work, voting procedures, etc.

Each delegate is assigned to one of fourteen committees. We have twelve delegates so alternates

can attend (without a voice) the other 2 committees so that the Holston delegation has information about the entire scope of the petitions and resolutions submitted. These committees have been meeting monthly to read, discuss, debate, share, report, organize, combine and edit the petitions sorted to their respective committee. Three of the delegates attended this briefing: Del Holley was elected to serve in General Conferences and has attended these as a delegate since 2008. Becky Hall was elected to serve in General Conferences and has attended these as a delegate since 2004. This is Donna Mosby's first year to serve and attend.

Worship services from countries all over the world will take place throughout this conference. There will be sermons, scripture reading, hymn singing, and prayers throughout the day. Translators will be busy through the entire conference. In between services the first week of the conference will entail committees hashing through assigned petitions: sorting, combining, discarding, and editing drafts to put forward to the conference for debate, for amending, and voting. The original 1099 petitions will not go to the floor. Delegates can choose to vote in bulk or to vote to dismiss/postpone any petitions. After each committee reports, the plenary sessions (debate, discussion, and voting) on that committee's assigned petitions take place during the second week. This will be livestreamed. The work has been going on for years. All work and legislation from this General Conference will go into effect in 2025 unless otherwise noted.

I am praying that the delegates are not influenced by the press and public outcry so that they can vote according to the Lord's will. These courageous volunteers are giving their time and witness as they are bombarded by others who are not fully informed. These delegates are going to their briefings, listening, answering questions, and trying to share their faith in the system the Lord provided to John Wesley through scriptures and prayer.

I welcome chatting with you, answering questions about what I've discovered, and listening to concerns. Please continue to love one another as we work to serve the Lord and help make disciples. As in all things, we can agree to disagree and still work together for Christ and Our Heavenly Father.

Please pray, read scripture, stay informed, and have faith that this is in God's hands, that He is fully aware of this Conference, and has His hands in the outcome. Thy will be done.
