#### From the Pastor's Study:

"Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to God, just as he had done before." -Daniel 6:10

August is upon us, and I must admit that I am excited about it. Personally, I am excited because we have celebrated several milestones in our family over the course of the last several weeks. Our oldest daughter Sydney has stepped into the new world of being a 1st Grader and will be a 6 year old



this month. Molly is talking more and more, and running around faster than ever! I celebrated my 37th year around the sun, and Julie and I had our 11-year anniversary. The months of July/August have naturally become a festive and celebratory time for our family, and a season of milestones.

I know that many of us "celebrate" during this time of year because August marks the beginning of something new. Educators, students, and parents often use August to mark a rite of passage to the next school grade, or the next group of students. Some among us may be starting a new job or career or beginning University classes. Some of us may even recognize that August kicks off the downhill slide to the festive season of fall.

Just as August often provides milestones to recognize, it also inevitably provides the opportunity to fully get back in the swing of things after summer. This means fulfilling responsibilities for loved ones and friends, like doctors' visits, attending games, running errands, and getting folks to and from school, or practices. No matter your age, August promises to have a more complex schedule with more responsibility. It is a fun but equally busy time.

As we shift into a busier season I want to invite all of you to strive to carve away some time for something simple. I want to invite you to try to talk with God everyday. An ancient Old Testament prayer practice that Jesus would have participated in was to pray three times a day: Morning, Noon, and Evening. As the authors of Common Prayer: A Liturgy for Ordinary Radicals, say, "The daily cycle of prayer–morning, midday, and evening—is like a heartbeat for the global church, passing from one time zone to the next each day, so that we as a people can, as the apostle Paul taught us, pray without ceasing."

As we move into August with all its natural complexities and milestones, I want to invite you to give yourself the gift of striving to pray as Daniel does. I want to invite you to check in with God three times a day. This could mean praying for others, praying through the Psalms, offering the Lord's Prayer, doing an Upper Room Devotional, or even using a breviary. (A breviary is a book for guided prayer. Some great ones that I have used in the past are: Guide to Prayer by Upper Room Books, The Divine Hours by Phyllis Tickle, The Book of Common Prayer, Common Prayer for Ordinary Radicals, and Christian Prayer: The Liturgy of the Hours.)

May we allow daily prayer to simply nourish our hearts, minds, and bodies even as things promise to get busier as fall approaches. I hope that you will find ways to cultivate this simple practice in your own devotional life this month.



#### The Sunday Bible Fellowship - Ten Men of the Bible

We meet after services most Sundays and enjoy lunch provided by volunteer cooks. Each lesson is a capsule of scripture, thoughtful discussion and a story from the Bible from a book written by Max Lucado. The writing style is both humorous and thought pro-



voking providing a glimpse of what it would look like in the modern day. We share this time together to talk about the lesson as well as what is happening in the world around us until about 1:15 p.m.

Anyone is welcome any Sunday we meet. You don't have to come every session. We don't gather on holiday Sundays or the third Sunday.

You don't have to read the book but it will help your understanding in our discussions. (I will order extra books.) We go through a summary of the lesson and choose questions to discuss as we go through the five days of learning more about the lesson the Lord has given us in scripture. We find out about ties from the Old and New Testaments.

"The men of the Bible were not perfect by any means: Noah drank too much. Job thought he knew more than God. Moses murdered a man. David committed adultery. Joseph risked his reputation. Matthew was a tax collector. Lazarus...died. Peter betrayed Christ. Paul killed Jesus' followers. We find our hopes and struggles in the pages of the Bible that tell their stories."

Our church has a unique opportunity to become the lead Church for the community Café in Madisonville. The Presbyterian





# What's Going on in the UMC? Let's have a watch party!

The purpose of this event will be for our community to get informed about what is going on in the denomination and to talk about it together. #### **New Opportunities for Dialogue**

In anticipation of the United Methodist Church's General Conference beginning on April 23rd, 2024, our congregation will enter a season of intentional dialogue that will extend from Au-

gust 2023 until after our denomination's General Conference meeting. This will be a time of prayer, exploration, discernment, study, sharing, and discussion. Rev. Chris Black will be hosting several events and opportunities for shared dialogue around issues that he anticipates will come up at the next General Conference. All of the upcoming events will be informative in nature, but will also encourage discussion from all participants.

Beginning in September, Rev. Chris Black will offer a six week class called "Conversations," which will focus on the divisions that are currently present in the United Methodist Church. Each week the class will put prominent conservative and progressive voices from within and outside the UMC in dialogue with each other. The hope is that these conversations will naturally create opportunities for dialogue amongst our own community members. Later in the fall, our congregation will also have the opportunity to participate in a couple of straw polls in the coming months, as well as listening posts, and community wide discussions.

#### **Musings from Marlee:**

#### Summer is not over...



... but the play days of summer have dwindled. School is back in session. The summer heat is still a part of each day, but now instead of finding shade, cooling off in a

pool or lake, and sipping iced beverages, many of our group are heading into classrooms longing for the chance to be back outside.

Routines change. It is so easy to be frustrated, bothered, anxious, even overwhelmed with the expectations of the next school year. Students complain about having to sit all day doing work and then coming home to more responsibilities. Teachers feel the pressure of expectations from parents, students, and administration. Parents try to figure out when they can get it all done so that their children have a successful year. Anyone interacting with any of these people need to remember the change of temperament this causes.

Stress sneaks into the excitement of a new year of hoping for better, learning expectations, and interacting with friends. Rules flourish. Questions flourish. Answers seem to shorten. "How was school today?" "Fine." "Okay." "Whew!"

hope so you'll all be together in this, no one left out, no one left behind. I know you're already doing this; just keep on doing it."

What if you begin the day with a short sentence of prayer that each of you chime in together? While everyone is trying to find everything needed to get out the door on time, just pause and repeat your family prayer for the new year. It can be as short as, "Dear Lord, Help us through this day to become the best we can be." You might need to repeat it a couple of times as the day progresses, but at the end of the day you can share, "This is what I did that helped me to become better." "This is where I saw the Lord make a difference in my day."

At night encourage a prayer of thanks for all of the workers in school to get the rest they need so that tomorrow will be even better. Pray for those who interact with school whether you know their names or not. Ask your children to identify particular people that might need an uplifting prayer. Instill prayer into the day and see what a difference it makes. Isaiah 4:29-31


