We welcome a new year in ministry on the heels of a beautiful, rich, and meaningful Advent season. It was such a joy to celebrate my 3rd Advent/Christmas season as your pastor in 2023. Throughout November and December I prayed and reflected deeply about how our church community should enter into the year 2024, and the phrase that kept coming to mind was, "foster mission rooted in the Word."

As I have mentioned in worship before (and in print) I believe one of the most tragic parts of modern Christian discipleship in the 21st century continues to be how rampant biblical illiteracy is becoming. This problem is intergenerational and it is caused by a myriad of cultural and social issues that I won't try to tackle in this note. Suffice it to say, I think we should respond both individually and collectively by engaging anew with God's word this year. I believe, just as our founder John Wesley did, that "searching the scriptures" can be a means of God's Grace, and that doing this as a practice can lead all people to deeper belief in God, informing them about salvation and how to live out Christ's teachings.

I also believe that we have a prime opportunity as a community of faith to be in mission in creative new ways during this coming year. We celebrated the retirement of our building loan on December 10th 2023, and now have an opportunity to move forward as a congregation into new ways of fulfilling Jesus' "Great Commission" as his disciples. (See scripture note above.)

My hope is that each of you will find new ways to be rooted in God's word this year, and that each of you would pray about at least one new way that our congregation could be in mission to our community here in Madisonville.

It is a privilege to continue to serve as your Pastor in this new year, and I look forward to seeing you around the church, in service, in study, or in worship.

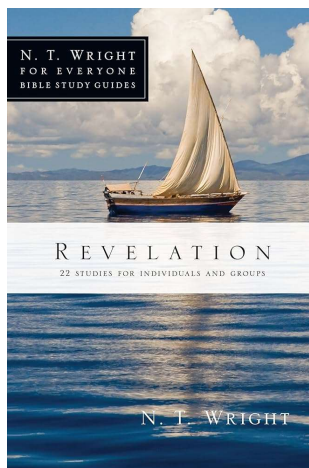

Community Café Report

We have now just completed 4 full months hosting Community Café at First UMC Madisonville. The companion churches have all continued bringing food and servers, and we have placed our own mark and upgrades on the services provided to these valuable members of our community. For example, we are serving meals on real dinnerware with real silverware. This means the people served are having a more formal and dignified "dining" experience. It also means we have used our dishwasher a great deal more, saving the landfill and our environment some plastic waste. As a church team, we have come up with procedures and efficiencies that allow us to effectively begin serving meals at 5 PM, and be finished with cleaning and ready to leave by 7 PM. We are incredibly proud to be able to serve wonderful meals to this grateful clientele.

We have some other great news as well! We satisfied the requirements and requests for information to the East Tennessee Foundation, and have received in full the grant monies for 2024. We made goals to help enrich the service to those in need in our community and are looking forward to achieving those goals. Our numbers vary, as we never know how many will attend, but all who do attend the Café enjoy the fellowship as well as the food. Thank you for your continued support financially as well as serving at the dinner. Pastor's Community Assistance Fund End-of-Year Report

The Pastor's Community Assistance Fund (PCAF) is a ministry of our church that allows us to act as the hands and feet of Christ whenever we encounter individuals in need of food, clothing, transportation, housing, or other needs of life. Sadly, most of these individuals are used to hearing "No" when approaching parts of our community for help. We at First UMC, however, are proud of our ability to say "yes" whenever we are approached by people both housed and unhoused, with and without transportation, and with a plethora of life stories and experiences that would be foreign to most of us.

In 2023, the Pastor's Community Assistance fund has been incredibly busy. As of the end of 2023, we have 147 active case files of individual clients who have received assistance at least once this last year. We do actively seek and investigate instances where some may be trying to take advantage of us, and hence never provide cash assistance. However, we acknowledge that hunger, poverty, and unique needs exist.

This generous congregation has this year made \$7,955.13 in contributions to the PCAF, from which we have been able to provide \$4,380.22 in direct aid to our clients. That aid breaks down to:

Food Assistance	\$ 2,142.54
Rental/Housing	\$ 69.03
Utilities Assistance	\$ 552.31
Transportation and Fuel	\$ 1,220.85
Miscellaneous/Other	\$ 395.49

This leaves PCAF with a healthy balance of \$ 3,574.91 going forward into Winter, 2024. Because of you, our church has developed a solid reputation as the hands and feet of Christ in our community.
