Mission Trip 2022: Princeton, Kentucky

Dec. 10, 2021 will forever be etched in the minds of the people in and around Princeton, Kentucky, as a one-mile wide EF4 tornado ripped through the area. The devastation will make you shake your head and bring you to tears before you can even think to hold them back.

When our team arrived for a week-long mission trip, the damage was evident but so was a strong community of grateful, kind and caring people. The congregation at First Christian Church and the coordinators for CrossRoads Missions greeted us with smiles and radical hospitality (a mission of the church).

Our group's theme for the week was "What do they see when they see me?" We centered our daily devotions around that theme. What I saw was a team excited to help others, ready to learn new skills and welcoming to the people around them. I saw young adults and (slightly) older adults up early, lifting each other and encouraging them to have a great day. I saw our Youth share stories and experiences during devotions that were so open and honest they took my breath away. Our group grew stronger together and - I hope - stronger in our faith.

Our team of 12 youth (+ Mia) and eight adult leaders were ready to help our neighbors. For more than half of our Youth, this was their first mission trip. I'm guessing they were a little curious, a little nervous and a little excited about what they would be doing. One thing is for certain, though, everyone was ready to get started. On Monday morning, Curtis - the project coordinator for CrossRoads Missions - met with us to go through the projects he had available. He told us about Josh's and Jerry's homes and told us to talk about what our group wanted to do. Our adult leaders looked at each other and without hesitation said we would take on both projects. That's the kind of determination we go with into the mission trip.




