

From the Pastor's Study:

As we enter May, I am reminded of all the transitions that often take place during this month, especially for many of our young people. We will have graduations, and the end of another school year for teachers and administrators. Some of our parents will be making the shift toward summer childcare, and many young people will be starting summer jobs. Also, many will be going on trips to rest or will look to spend time outside with family and friends. May can be a fun time as we shift from the



unpredictable weather of spring to the promise of warmer days in the summer. Devotionally, I have found myself in a season of transition now that Lent/Holy Week are behind us. During this month I am planning on re-reading Paul's epistle to the Romans, which begins this way:

"Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ, To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Romans 1: 1-7

The English translation of these first verses of Paul's letter makes for a really long sentence! Did you notice that it takes a long time to get to that first period? In this text Paul opens one of his most theologically expansive letters with a powerful assertion. He proclaims that he is called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of Christ. He is explicitly clear about who he is in relation to Jesus Christ and the work that God is continuing to do through the good news of our Savior. Later he reminds the Romans, (and us many years later,) that we have a clear identity as well!

As disciples, we are called "to belong to Jesus Christ" alone. This means as Christians we are called to prioritize our own growth in God's "grace and apostleship" and to invite others into (or teach others about) this life of "obedience of faith." We can do this in many different ways. John Wesley encouraged his followers to intentionally utilize what he called "the Means of Grace." Things like prayer, searching the scriptures, worship, serving others, visiting the sick or imprisoned, and partaking of the sacraments. For Wesley, these were outward and inward practices that were meant to intentionally deepen one's love for God, and for others.

As we move into May and the summer months, I want to invite you to try to do one thing different to deepen your relationship with God, and to reach out to (or serve) others in faith. This could mean doing something like making time to pray at noon each day for the whole month, or even seeing how you could get involved with feeding the hungry here in Monroe County. Whatever it is, I hope you will be creative with how you express how you "belong to Jesus Christ."

The Sunday Bible Fellowship—Ten Men of the Bible

We meet after services most Sundays and enjoy lunch provided by volunteer cooks. Each lesson is a capsule of scripture, thoughtful discussion and a story from the Bible from a book written by Max Lucado. The writing style is both humorous and thought provoking providing a glimpse of what it would look like in the modern day. We share this time together to talk about the lesson as well as what is happening in the world around us until about 1:15 p.m.

Anyone is welcome any Sunday we meet. You don't have to come every session. We don't gather on holiday Sundays or the third Sunday. You don't have to read the book but it will help your understanding in our discussions. (I will order extra books.) We go through a summary of the lesson and choose questions to discuss as we go through the five days of learning more about the lesson the Lord has given us in scripture. We find out about ties from the Old and New Testaments.

"The men of the Bible were not perfect by any means: Noah drank too much. Job thought he knew more than God. Moses murdered a man. David committed adultery. Joseph risked his reputation. Matthew was a tax collector. Lazarus...died. Peter betrayed Christ. Paul killed Jesus' followers. We find our hopes and struggles in the pages of the Bible that tell their stories."

We will begin with an introduction to Ten Men of the Bible on May 28th if that study sounds intriguing to you. Marlee will order those books (\$15) if you are interested in joining us. Hiwassee District Hands-On Mission College Graduates Project for 2023

The Hiwassee District has begun the process of collecting Health Kits which will go to benefit folks in Liberia. Throughout the month of April a box will be available in the gathering area labeled "Health Kits for Liberia." This is part of broader Holston Conference effort to annually provide Health, Education, and Food resources to the people of Liberia and Zimbabwe. The Hiwassee district goal is 400 kits.

Here are the instructions to make one:

Pack these items in a 2-gallon Zip-Loc bag:

1 hand towel 1 washcloth 2 toothbrushes 2 tubes toothpaste (6.4. oz. or less) 1 bottle shampoo (15 oz. or less) 1 bottle lotion (18 oz. or less) 1 bottle roll-on deodorant (4 oz. or less) 1 small spray perfume/cologne/body mist (4 oz. or less)

Pack these separately in sandwich-size Zip-Loc bag— please do NOT put in larger 2-gallon bag:

1tube antibacterial ointment (1 oz.) 1 bottle Tylenol/acetaminophen 500mg (24 ct.)

**Please include \$ 5.00 per kit to cover the shipping costs to Africa. Please put the money/check for your kits in a separate envelope — do not put money in the Zip-Loc container itself.

High School Graduates Reception




