### From the Pastor's Study...

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18)

November is traditionally a month when we are encouraged to give thanks and consider all the ways we have been blessed. During the next couple of months we also usually find more time to gather with family and friends to share, eat and visit.

Every time I think about all the unique traditions of this month I am reminded of the verse offered above from Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians. He is encouraging the early disciples {and us nearly 2,000 years later} to adopt a simple path of walking through our daily lives in constant conversation with God, but with gratitude on our hearts and lips. As I considered this, I was reminded of a quote from St. Therese of Lisieux who said, "Prayer is an aspiration of the heart. It is a simple glance directed to heaven. It is a cry of gratitude and love in the midst of trial as well as joy." Her words point to the tremendous power that prayer can have in our everyday lives and in our relationships with others. This month I hope you can find some daily moments to talk with God, and to find ways to say thank you to God for the blessings in your life, even when things are challenging. This simple path of prayer mixed with gratitude can be a beautiful way to mark the days of November as disciples of Jesus Christ.

I hope you will be on the lookout for opportunities here at the church to pray for one another, to study, to worship, and to be in fellowship together. November is a time in the church year that often previews the deeply rich season of preparation called Advent. This year, Advent will begin on Sunday, December 1st. My hope as your Pastor is that the month of November, and the upcoming season of Advent, will be a time for us to continue to grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ together via the simple path offered above. May we grow deeper in love with God and with one another through prayer, and may others come to know about God's love through how we rejoice and give thanks as a church community.





### **Charge Conference in November**
