### From the Pastor's Study...

March has arrived, and as winter gives way to spring, we continue our Lenten journey together. As you know, Lent is a unique time in the life of the church, where we set aside 40 days to intentionally deepen our relationship with God. This could occur through adding spiritual practices or even doing acts of mission/service in Christ's name. You could also deepen your relationship with God by "fasting" from things that might get in the way of that connection. This could mean taking a long break from social media in order to pray or turning off the TV at night to search the scriptures before you sleep. Overall, Lent provides us (as Christ's disciples) with the opportunity to grow in the faith. As I said last month, Lent is a time for evangelism but also true conversion—a time for growing through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting and being signs of God's kingdom in our community and world.

My prayer for you this month is that you will lean into the scheduled moments presented in this newsletter, to be present and engaged in the life of our church. There are opportunities to be in service, but also fellowship, study and prayer together. Even if you've never done a Lenten practice before, you can jump in and participate this month. As you consider this, I want to invite you to ask yourselves: "What is one thing that I could give up that distracts me from God and what is one thing that I could add that draws me closer to God?"

As you consider this, I invite you to join me in keeping these verses of scripture from Hebrews 10: 19-25 before you this month: "Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day approaching."

I look forward to seeing you around the church this month!

# **New Sermon Series coming during Lent**

Pastor Chris will introduce a new 5 week sermon series beginning on March 9th called. "I AM". In this series he will be exploring the famous "I AM" statements by Jesus in the gospel of John. The season of Lent is a time to remember one very important thing about what it means to be a Christian: "that when Jesus goes to the cross, there goes God." In the midst of this we are naturally reminded that to believe in Jesus is to hold the fullness of Jesus' humanity and Jesus' divinity together. Each time Jesus says, "I AM," the entirety of the "I AM" statements stands behind this revelation. When he says, "I AM" it gives us a glimpse of who he was and is now as God's incarnate. Consider the following quotation circulating on social media: "I AM. Two of the most powerful words; for what you put after them shapes your reality."

# Here are the instructions for assembling a 2025 relief bucket:

Pack in a NEW 5-Gallon Bucket with a Lid: 1 Bag of Sugar (4-5 lb.) 1 Bag of Rice (2 lb.) 1 Bag of Dried Beans (2 lb.)

1 Powdered/Dried Milk (NO larger than 64 oz.)

1 Oatmeal (18 oz. or less)

1 Cooking Oil (48 oz. or less) 2 Cans of Meat: ham (1 lb can), spam

or tuna (12 oz can) \$8.00 Check/Cash for shipping

Please bring your completed bucket to the gathering area. They will be taken to the Hiwassee District collection site at a later date.

## Ash Wednesday Worship & Family Night Supper on March 5th

Ash Wednesday is a unique day in the church year where we gather to mark the beginning of the 40 day season of Lent. Our worship together will be a time to put aside past sins and failures through repentance and to kick off a period of time to foster new beginnings in our relationship with Jesus Christ. In worship we will focus on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Christ.

While the use of ashes as a sign of mortality and penance may be new to some, it has a significant history in both Jewish and Christian worship.

The imposition of ashes can be a powerful way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. We hope you will join us for a special service of worship on **Wednesday**, **March 5th at 7:00pm** in our Main Sanctuary.

Before the service, at 6:00pm, plan to join us in the Fellowship Hall for a light soup & bread dinner. This will also be the dinner for the Ignite and Youth groups.

# "Read Together" in March

This year Rev. Chris Black invites you to participate in the Holston Conference's "Read Together" initiative. This opportunity challenges us to read through the whole Bible in one year. In 2025, we will be reading the Bible chronologically using a path laid out in J. Ellsworth Kalas' "*The Grand Sweep: 365 Days from Genesis through Revelation*". This reading plan asks us to read only 2-3 chapters a day which will be much less burdensome than previous years' studies.

Participating in this initiative as a whole congregation can uniquely bind us together as Christ's disciples all while rooting us more deeply in God's word. Even if you didn't read every assigned reading in January/February you are welcome to jump back in! There are schedules available in the welcome center with each month's readings.
