## From the Pastor's Study...

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing...If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love." -John 15:5 & 10

Happy New Year!

We welcome a new year in ministry on the heels of an Advent that was incredibly beautiful, rich and meaningful. It was such a joy to celebrate my fourth Advent/Christmas season as your pastor. Throughout November and December I did something I do every year. I prayed and reflected deeply about how our church community should enter into the new year. 2025 is full of promise for us, and we are in such a wonderful place as a church community. As I contemplated how we should be postured as we move into 2025 the phrase that kept coming to mind was, "cultivating a more personal relationship with Christ."

One of the easiest ways to do this is to know Jesus's story in the gospels, and to familiarize ourselves with the way that Christ is alluded to throughout all of the Bible. As I have mentioned in worship before (and in print) I believe one of the most tragic parts of modern Christian discipleship in the 21st century continues to be how rampant biblical illiteracy is becoming. This problem is intergenerational and it is caused by a myriad of cultural and social issues that I won't try to tackle in this note. Suffice it to say, I think we should respond both individually and collectively by engaging anew with God's word this year. I believe, just as our founder John Wesley did, that "searching the scriptures" can be a means of God's Grace, and that doing this as a practice can lead all people to deeper belief in God, informing them about salvation and how to live out Christ's teachings.

In this edition of the newsletter there are a couple of new ways that we will be engaging with God's word as a community; these include our worship together, a new weekly Bible study I will be hosting, and our read together initiative. You are also invited to take advantage of our great classes which happen both prior to and after worship each week. My hope and prayer for you this month is that you will take advantage of at least one new way to be engaged with the Bible and that you will be on the lookout for other ways in the coming months as we continue together in ministry in 2025.

It is a privilege to continue to serve as your Pastor in this new year, and I look forward to seeing you around the church or in worship.
