## From the Pastor's Study...

Happy February! We had a beautifully snowy and cold January and we are entering another winter month that may have some of the same weather in store for us. The month of February in the church year is often a "gap" period between two big seasons. We have just come out of Christmastide/Epiphany, but we aren't quite to Lent just yet. In the last week or so I have been rereading 1st and 2nd Peter for personal devotions. One group of verses that caught my attention comes from 1 Peter: 7-9:

"These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls."

As I have reflected on this, it struck me that even as we enter one of the coldest and dreariest of months outside...and even if we face seemingly insurmountable personal challenges or struggles...Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is the same now and forever, and he is with us no matter what we are going through. ## **Read Together in February**

This year Rev. Chris Black invites you to join him in participating in the Holston Conference's **Read Together** initiative. This opportunity challenges us to read through the whole Bible in one year. In 2025, we will be reading the Bible chronologically using a path laid out in J. Ellsworth Kalas' "The Grand Sweep: 365 Days from Genesis through Revelation". The reading plan asks us to read only 2-3 chapters a day which will be much less burdensome than previous years' studies.

Participating in this initiative as a whole congregation can uniquely bind us together as Christ's disciples all while rooting us more deeply in God's word. Even if you didn't read all of the assigned readings in January you are welcome to jump back in! There are schedules available in the welcome center with each month's readings. ### Ash Wednesday Worship & Family Night Supper on March 5th

Ash Wednesday is a unique day in the church year where we gather to mark the beginning of the 40 day season of Lent. Our worship together will be a time to put aside past sins and failures through repentance and to kick off a period of time to foster new beginnings in our relationship with Jesus Christ. In worship we will focus on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Christ.

While the use of ashes as a sign of mortality and penance may be new to some, it has a significant history in both Jewish and Christian worship. The imposition of ashes can be a powerful way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. We hope you will join us for a special service of worship on Wednesday, March 5th at 7:00pm in our Main Sanctuary.

Before the service, at 6:00pm, plan to join us in the Fellowship Hall for a light soup/bread dinner. Please let Sue Hamilton know if you are able to provide soup or bread. This will also be the dinner for the Ignite and youth groups.
