OLD BUSINESS:

Kozy Rest Sewage Expansion: Executive session was held on 9-29-22 between the supervisors, Solicitor and the Engineer to discuss matters. A discussion was held on 10-4-22 with Marion Township and Harrisville Borough to focus on a collaborative direction. Secretary sent letters to residents on Campground Rd. between Kozy Rest and the end of the public sewer line on 10-6-22 to ask if they are interested in connecting to the private line, with a requested response by Noon on 10-12-22. A meeting was held on 10-12-22 between the Supervisors, Solicitor, Engineer, Harrisville Borough and Marion Township Board members to further discuss how to proceed.

Sewage:

- 1. Incomplete connections/inspections: D. Brown #2; D. Frampton; M. Humes; V. Kennedy 108 Boyers & 645 WMS; J. McFeaters; R. Williams.
- 2. Delinquencies: Sent to S. Gallagher after 10/1/2022 invoicing. Eleven (11) properties (9 owners) currently are delinquent by 5 months or more. Six (6) are 3-4 months delinquent. Increased from last month. The two letters sent to the two delinquent accounts who are paying monthly but were asked to pay more to help pay down their outstanding balance elicited no response or increased payments.
- 3. Property Liens: D. Frampton*; F. Carroll-Gillen; J. Green*; S. Heller*; M. Humes*; V. Kennedy (3 properties); J. McFeaters*; R. Williams.
- 4. Sheriff sale: Two (2) properties with current liens who are severely delinquent and/or not connected have been title searched. The solicitor recommends contacting the mortgage companies to request payment as the next step. <u>Motion</u> to have the solicitor send a notice to the respective mortgage companies for each property to request payment on each property: Second:
