

WEB SITE COMPLIANCE FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

On June 30, 2021, Colorado enacted the Colorado Laws For Persons With Disabilities. This law, House Bill 21-1110, added language to various Colorado statutes to strengthen protections against discrimination on the basis of disability and provided accessibility requirements for websites maintained by special districts.¹

Ongoing Compliance Information

By July 1, 2024, the District's website will be in compliance with the accessibility standards adopted by the Governor's Office of Information Technology (the "OIT") (W3C Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.0 AA). The requirements for accessibility include:

- Maintain all documents on the website available in .pdf format;
- Availability of a site map, search bar, and navigation menu;
- Providing alternative text under images, charts, and infographics to explain them to the visually impaired;
- Creating a site that is navigable solely via keyboard;
- Including closed captions or a transcript of the meetings if meetings are recorded in a video format and made available on the website;
- Using descriptive page titles that clearly explain the content of the page.
