Daniel Fischberg, MD - Mitsuo Aoki Community Service Awardee

Dr. Daniel Fischberg is a Professor and Chief of the Division of Palliative Medicine in the Department of Geriatric Medicine at the John A. Burns School of Medicine of the University of Hawai'i. Since 2004, he has served as the founding Medical Director for the Pain and Palliative Care Service at The Queen's Medical Center in Honolulu. Since moving to Hawai'i, Dr. Fischberg has volunteered for Kōkua Mau, Hawaii's award-winning movement to improve care and currently serves as Vice-President of the Board of Directors.

Following undergraduate study at the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Fischberg attended The Mount Sinai School of Medicine where he earned his MD and PhD degrees. Dr. Fischberg completed an internal medicine residency at The Mount Sinai Hospital and fellowship training in pain and palliative care at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center.

Dr. Fischberg holds board certification in Internal Medicine, Pain Medicine, Addiction Medicine and Hospice and Palliative Medicine and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine. Dr. Fischberg is recognized as a national expert in the areas of enhancing pain and palliative care education for health care professionals, improving access to palliative care for patients at all stages of illness, and advancing evidence-based practice in palliative medicine.

Kahu David Baumgart Turner - Guest Speaker

Kahu David Baumgart Turner is the current pastor at the Church of the Crossroads. Raised in Hawaii, David is a keiki o ka`aina (child of the land) whose spirituality has been shaped and enriched by the gifts of these islands, its people, and inherent wisdom. With a family history that stretches seven generations in Hawai'i, his connection to the land, culture, and values of Hawai'i is profound and deeply rooted and has always informed a much-varied career. He has been blessed with a multitude of career realities, from teacher, chaplain, non-profit executive director, entrepreneur, and preacher. David received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology and Political Science from Stanford University in 1979 and his Master of Divinity from Yale Divinity School in 1987.
