### LOOKING AHEAD...

LOOKING AHEAD TO NEXT SATURDAY, WE ARE BACK ON THE ROAD AGAIN AND AS EVER IN THIS WIDESPREAD DIVISION, IT'S A LONG DISTANCE TREK - IN FACT 110 MILES DOOR-TO-DOOR AT TAVISTOCK IN DEVON.

The town sits on the western edge of Dartmoor, not far from the famous jail - which means the Tavistock back four have probably heard many times the question of whether, in football parlance, they "take any prisoners"!

This division is not only wide in its geographical spread, but also wide-open with regard to predicting results. It seems that anyone - perhaps with the exception of Yate - can be beaten.

So the crystal ball has many cracks in it from months of wondering just how certain results happened. Tavvy, for example, started the season well, collecting, amongst others, a prize scalp at Fortress Mousehole and a good draws at Malvern and Larkhall.

Earlier in the season they gave us a scare here at the Veho - only a brilliant penalty save by Mack Allan prevented Bash from going 2-0 down before half-time, but a roller-coaster second half ended with Charlie Wagstaffe chipping in our last-minute winner.

Also, like many clubs in Division One South of the Southern League - including Bashley -Tavistock have ambitions to soon go at least one step higher, and beyond that "if feasible financially."

They are now playing at the highest level in their amazing 136-year history and have recruited players who share that ambition to move on higher - so this game, like all others in this division, will be keenly competitive.

In Aaron Dearing they have a highly-experienced keeper, and a defence which is also packed with players who are ever-reliable such as Ben Cross, Jack Endacott and lestyn Harris.

Their midfield revolves around men like Tallan Burns, Charlie Elkington, Ben Steer, Ed Harrison and Reuben Kane - and up front they have recognised hot-shots at this level, including Alex Battle, and one of the division's most frequent scorers, Liam Prynn.

The Tavistock club had a fascinating - and highly unusual - start to life. They started out in the 1870s playing "Adhoc Football" a cross between Football, Rugby Union - "and perhaps a few other games as well" - with matches played between Tavistock and a similar set-up from Plymouth.

Legend has it that a letter to the Tavistock Gazette from a follower of the mixed sport, suggested sticking to Football - and that attracted interest from two local businessmen, brothers Herbert and Wilfred Spencer.

In 1888 they called a meeting at Tavistock Guildhall, and there was sufficient interest for them to go ahead and form the present club, which played then at Tavistock Grammar School and won its firstever match, 1-0 - against the Duke of Cornwall Light Infantry!

Their first season playing record was... Played 17, won 13, lost 3, drawn 1. There's no doubt the present-day Tavvy would have love that sort of pro-rata percentage this season!

Back in the "real world", Tavistock are not going quite as well as they hoped so far, after a bright start they are now hovering in the lower positions.

ashley physio and former gymnast turned trampolinist Reighan Taylor says it's only natural for teams to hit a dip at this time of year, but she tips the Black and Gold to bounce back with a spring in their step after winter.

Dave Lewis' side have slipped from the playoff spots to mid table after going eight games without a win, with four defeats on the trot over the festive period. Their last victory was a 3-2 home win over Tavistock in late November.

"With the weather and the ground being a lot harder it becomes a lot trickier at this time of year for the players but they are all pushing through and doing ok," said the 22-year-old sports therapy graduate of Bournemouth University.

"I think they started the season off so well. The team is brilliant, they work hard together and I think there have been a few injuries, but each player has tried to get back to their best as soon as possible.

"It's quite natural to be disappointed (with recent results) but they always bounce back and are determined to do better next time." Looking forward, she said - bar results - the team had actually escaped the dreaded winter lull relatively unscathed, making for what should be a more stable Spring.

"We've got a few players who have just returned from injury and only one injured at the moment (Conor Whiteley) and he's due back to training next week, so all in all the squad is doing alright for injuries at the moment. At the beginning of the season we seemed to have a lot more injuries but we are not doing too bad at the moment injury-wise.

"It has been a lot more challenging but there's a good spirit in the group, they are all positive as a group of lads and I think they'll do well going forward."

Taylor took over from 'Diggo' (Paul Diggins) as Bashley's head physio this season after the latter was ruled out through illness. She had served her third year placement under him last season before graduating over the summer and now takes the reigns until he can hopefully make a full comeback.

"I was asked by the players to return as they knew me already from last season," said Taylor. "It was quite nice to hear that they wanted me back and it's nice to be back. I felt quite comfortable coming in as I knew a lot of the players already and I've felt very welcomed since day one really."

Her now-paid role involves massage, taping up and rehabilitation exercises for players at Tuesday training to prepare them for Saturday games and travelling home and away with the team throughout the season.

"If they are injured I will take them out of a training session and do some tailored rehab programmes to get them back to match fitness."

January player incomings and outgoings could test her knowledge of each new player, she added.

"I always have to make sure they come in fully fit and ask about their previous injuries but I've not had much to deal with regarding new players injury-wise so it's been a

nice run at the moment.

"The management and coaches are brilliant, we are always in chats with them about injured players and they are always checking in with me and value my opinion.

"I also feel like I've built a good relationship with the players, they are always chatting to me and making me feel welcome. They are a good group of lads, I really enjoy away days with them and I'm always made to feel really involved."

Balancing this with her delivery-driver day job makes for a compact working week.

"But I do enjoy being busy and find it easy to balance this work with my normal job, as it's quite relaxed it helps me focus on my physio'ing, and doing something different to physio makes for a nice change so I'm not always doing the same thing."

Asked why she opted for a role in sport, she replied, "I've been around sports my whole life having competed in gymnastics and trampolining from a young age at national level. "Whenever I got injured I was always interested in knowing why and how I got injured and how I can get fit enough to train again.

"I've always been around it and always knew I wanted to be involved in sport really, and I've always enjoyed helping others get back into what they love doing."

With interest in football in particular, the Southampton native and Saints fan said, "I quite enjoy watching football, so that's probably why I've chosen to physio for it over other sports."

The end goal?

"I really do enjoy being pitch side at the moment but the big picture is to have my own business in sports rehab, getting people back playing, and sports massage."

Asked if she like to move up the ranks with teams, she replied, "I hope so, I'm aiming big and want to do as well as I possibly can."

With women's football expanding and more and more opportunities opening up within the men's game for their female counterparts, Taylor said the future was bright.

"A lot more women are getting involved in this type of job and the women's game is on the up, it will only be a matter of time before Bashley has a women's team. There's potential for sure."



#### WESTBURY UTD FC - "THE WHITE HORSE MEN"

The club started in 1920 when two local sides amalgamated. Westbury Old Comrades FC had just won promotion to the First Division of the Wiltshire County League, and to strengthen the side they joined forces with a local junior side, Westbury Great Western Railway XI, and together they became Westbury United Football Club.

In its first season, the Club finished third from bottom of the County league and in the 1920's they struggled, but in the 1930's they won everything possible in Wiltshire football. In 1936 the Club reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. They were led by a magnificent player called Billy Pearce, who captained the County throughout the decade.

The Club has produced many players who have gone on to make the grade at professional football, two of them being centre forwards for Bristol City. The first was Reg Smith who played for City in the 1930s and was then transferred to Wolverhampton Wanderers for what was described in the Press as a 'considerable fee'.

The Club has had its share of dedicated officials who have given a lifetime of service. Former Club President, Ernie Barber, who passed away in December 2012, used to carry the team kit as a seven-year-old (1933) and after the war he started playing. When he finished playing, he became Secretary and held the post until the end of the 1996-97 season when he decided to retire.

At the beginning of the 2022/23 season, chairman Greg Coulson stepped down and was replaced by Sam Gooding. The season saw the club finish in its highest position in 103 years of 10th in the Southern League and lifted the Wiltshire Premier Shield after a 3-0 victory against Swindon Town FC.

During the 2023/24 season, Phil Hampson took over the role of chairman and the start of an exciting transformation of the club began. The club has new badge which has brought a new identity to the team but continues to have a strong management team of Ricky Hulbert and Lewis Porter.

#### **Player Profiles**

REDMAN EVANS (GK) Redman has impressed everyone on and off the pitch with both his performances and his integration into the club. A huge presence in the sticks.

STEVE HULBERT Predominantly a right back these days, but can play anywhere along the back line as well as in midfield if needed. The most intelligent player at the club and is a non-league football encyclopaedia.

RYAN BOLE (C) A thunderbolt of a left foot, a right foot to stand on. Hugely popular with everyone at the club and has shown incredible loyalty to the club over the past 2 seasons.

JAKE HUTCHINGS A classy, ball playing centre half who loves to defend but also has the ability to play any range of passes.

DAN RESTORICK Dan is a big centre half who is comfortable on the ball and his fitted in well amongst the lads.

LEON GREENLAND Leon's leadership qualities and no nonsense attitude on and off the pitch have been vital in the clubs' improved performances.

AARON COCKERILL Aggressive in his defending and comfortable on the ball, as well as being huge in the changing room, he has become a massive part of the club.

WILL TAYLOR Will is an all-action midfield player who can create chances for his attackers and will put his body on the line for his defenders. BRAD SELWOOD He's a tough tackling, hard running, goal scoring central midfield player, who at the tender age of 19 will go on to have a very good career in football.

AARON WITCHELL Witch can operate and full back but is mainly a midfield player. His fitness levels and quality on the ball have impressed us this season and he is going to be vital for us.

JACK WITCOMBE Jack is an exciting attacking player who can light up a game on his own. Jack is a goal scoring winger who will just as happily do his defensive work for the team.

ED BUTCHER An experienced winger with pace to burn and a thunderous left foot. Ed has fitted into the group well, demanding the high standards from others that he expects from himself.

BEVAN CROSS Bev is a hardworking wide player who has stepped up his levels this season, scoring plenty of goals during pre-season. He has a great attitude and a determination to improve

Bash might have been 2-1 up, but suddenly they were 2-1 down. Steve Walker slightly misjudged the flight of a cross from the right. It skimmed his head and landed exactly at the feet of the wrong person six yards out - goalscoring legend Brett Pitman.

So 2-1 down - against the run of play - Bash had to head uphill. Luke Holmes, Lewis Waterfield and Mitch Speechley-Price came off the bench - and it was Mitch who, literally had a hand, or rather two, in the equaliser.

From a throw-in wide left, he launched the ball right in to the mixer near the penalty spot. Bungay swung at it and the effort was blocked - but Bungay was first to the loose ball, slamming it home.


