For Challenge #9, Beth Porkert completed a machine quilted small hexagon quilt. Kristine Steine fashioned a jacket out of onesie pajamas. Her sister sent them to her when she was working for the government in Afghanistan. Cheryl Capes completed a Judy Neimeyer, paper pieced quilt that was striking. Pat used one yard of fabric from her stash and made snowflake hot pad Christmas gifts and used bias binding. The next challenge is # 10 for Dec. or # 7 because 7 was not used.

Anne was not feeling well so Jeanie provided the finance report.

One completed block and 2 border rectangles = one raffle tickets Fabric: Background black on white (**not black on cream**

please)

Tree green or holiday print

Border Strips black on white – two 2 1/2 "by 10 $^{1\!\!/_2}$ "

Press seams to the dark fabric.

Paper Piecing pattern available at September, October, and November guild meetings

If you are new to Paper Piecing, help will be available before guild meeting and during breaks.

When piecing, fabric should <u>extend beyond the dashed line</u> on the pattern. Block should be at least 7" by 9"

Yankee Swap Rules (for Holiday Party)

Each participant is asked to bring along a gift valued at \$20.

Participants draw numbers from a box to determine their swap order from 1 to the total number of participants. The participant will also fill out a tag with their name.

Round 1: The participant with #1 will hand the tag with their name to the MC and unwrap a gift from the row of gifts. The MC will place their tag to the gift's assigned letter.

Consecutive Rounds: The participant with the next number will hand the tag with their name to the MC and they can either "steal" an already opened gift, and their tag will be placed next to the gifts assigned letter. Or they can be adventurous and go for a wrapped gift from the row of gifts, and the MC will place their tag next to the gift's assigned letter.

If the participant chooses to steal an unwrapped gift, the person whose gift is stolen now repeats her turn and either steals another person's gift (she cannot immediately steal back the gift that was just stolen from her) or unwraps a new gift.

This cycle of stealing continues until a new gift is chosen, at which point the round ends and turn is passed to the participant with the next number.

A gift is "Safe" and cannot be stolen during that round, after it has been stolen 2 times.

Since items can be stolen, the item in your possession is not yours until the game is over.

After the last participant's turn (Round), the participant with the #1 has the option of keeping their current gift, or exchange gifts with anyone else.

Yankee Swap Gift Ideas and Tips

The gift you bring should be something you would be happy to receive. Your gift doesn't necessarily have to appeal to the entire group, it should be appropriate for more than a few people or at least something that can be regifted, otherwise someone might get stuck with something they have absolutely no use for.
