- Income Year-to- Date: \$4,531.01 and Expenses Year-to-Date: \$194.82.

- a. Last Saturday in March (3/26/22) is the rescheduled Charity Sew, we will be working on Heart Pillows. You will only need to bring your sewing machine and normal supplies; project kits will be supplied. Robin Allison has contacted Janice Turick, who has challenged the QuiltFest Sister Guilds to make Me Dolls and Heart Pillows, and she has requested that the items not be stuffed. This will make easier to store the items and volunteers at QuiltFest will be asked to stuff the Me Dolls and Hearts. They will accept donations of Stuffing/Polyfil.
- b. Robin Allison has reached out to Villages of Hope (a national program), who assist women who have been affected by sex trafficking, drug addiction and homelessness. The build homes similar to Habitat for Humanity, in addition, they provide job training, education, counseling and other services to their clients. They also set up solar powered trailer to provide a bed for the night. Thanks, Nikki Lustgarten, for making us aware of this new program in Jacksonville. When Robin Allison hears back from them, she will let us know how we can help.

Honeybee program Payment Policy

- For workshops, there will be a \$20 nonrefundable deposit (checks only) due at signup. Sign-up will close when the class is filled, or two weeks prior to event, whichever comes first. The deposit can be transferred to another member to take their place at the workshop.
