Sewing supplies you like to use - 1/4" foot, thread, bobbins, glass head pins, seam ripper, scissors, sewing machine needles, etc.

Fabric Requirements:

Precutting before class: Following the Cutting Instructions on your pattern cut your strips for your blocks. Be sure to label and organize your pieces by units and value. I will provide labeled paper plates for keeping organized during construction. Do not cut Outer Border length. 

Honeybee program payment policy

- Workshops, there will be a \$20 non-refundable deposit (checks only) due at signup. Signup will close when the class is filled, or two weeks prior to event, whichever comes first. The deposit can be transferred to another member to take their place at the workshop.
- Retreats, a non-refundable deposit is due at signup. (checks only) The amount will be determined by the amount of deposit required by the venue.
- Bus trips, there will be a non-refundable deposit due at signup, to hold a place on the bus and reserve the event ticket. Amount will be determined by the cost of the event and bus company deposit (checks only)
- All deposits will be refunded if the workshop or event is canceled

Blueberry Breakfast Bundt Cake

Ingredients

- baking spray
- 2 c <u>blueberries</u>, frozen (thawed) or fresh
- 1 tbs <u>all-purpose flour, to coat blueberries before adding to mix</u>
- 2 3/4 c all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp <u>baking powder</u>
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 3/4 c butter, unsalted, room temperature
- 2 c granulated sugar
- 4 eggs, room temperature
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/4 c vegetable oil
- 1 c sour cream, full fat, room temperature

Glaze

- 1 c <u>powdered sugar</u>
- 3-5 tsp milk, pour in a little bit of milk at a time, constantly stirring. The more milk will make the consistency more runny.

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Add the blueberries and 1 tablespoon of flour to a mixing bowl and toss together until all of the blueberries are coated with the flour. Set aside.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Set aside.
- 3. In another large mixing bowl, beat the butter and sugar for about 4-5 minutes until light and fluffy
- 4. Mix in the eggs one a time until well combined, then mix in the vanilla.
- 5. Add oil
- 6. Add the dry ingredients, alternating with the sour cream in small amounts.
- 7. Add the blueberries and stir carefully with a spatula
- 8. Spray a 10-inch bundt pan well with nonstick cooking spray. Pour the batter into the prepared bundt pan and evenly spread it around.
- 9. Bake at 350°F for 50-65 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the cake comes out clean. Cover loosely with foil if needed for the last 5-10 minutes of baking to prevent excess browning.
- 10. Remove from the oven and cool. Turn upside down onto a cooling rack. Once cooled, place on a platter and drizzle with glaze.

Glaze

 Mix powdered sugar and milk together. Add more or less milk based off of your consistency preferences.
