### Honey Bee Quilt Guild Minutes for March 3rd, 2020

The meeting was called to order by President Jeanie Jacobson at 7:00 p.m. She requested that personal complaints about individuals be settled with the source. If you have a complaint or concern about anything done or said, please resolve it with the individual.

There were 26 Members in attendance: Anna Turek, Annette Paulson, Beth Porkert, Carol McBryde, Cheryl McCain, Christine Besser, Connie Kight, Dawn Kelly, Elaine Stemetski, Jan Lipsky, Jeanie Jacobson, Karen Krueger, Kristine Stein, Lisa Ptubo-Daniel, Maggie Woods, Marie Breslin, Mary Alice Howle, Maureen Wasson, Michele Jackson, Nikki Levinson-Lustgarten, Pat Guilford, Peggy Fell, Pernie Gilbert, Robyn Eubanks, Sandy Kruszewski, and Trini Bowen.

Vice President: Beth Porkert decided to donate the guild Bingo equipment to her church rather than Middleburg Elementary School. She also reported that the Care Unit at her church was grateful for the contribution of charity quilts. An individual at her church also inquired about the possibility of commissioning someone to make a quilt for her grandchild. Beth recommended that the guild provide a listing on their website of individuals that would be willing to provide for hire services, such as long arm services, embroidery etc.

When Anne returns, we will ask her if that is feasible.

Secretary: Trini Bowen: Previous minutes stand corrected to read; Carolyn donated quilts to the Betty Griffin House not the Hubbard House. A motion was made to accept the minutes of the previous meeting by Kristine and seconded by Dawn.

Treasurer: Anne Morgan – Anne is out of town, but she sent the following finance report: In savings we have a current balance of \$13,143.38 and we have earned \$2.60 in interest. In checking, we have a balance of \$2,251.72.

Charity: Carolyn Allen  $-\frac{1}{2}$  the charity quilts were given to Betty Griffin House and half to a care unit at a Catholic church.

Challenges: Mary Alice Howle – The Travel and Trip challenge is due in May. You can use travel fabric, make travel accessories, use destination fabric or create any other personal travel related item.

The "Twenty-Twenty" challenge is due in September. The project can be any theme you wish but can't exceed 20" x 20". It must contain the following 20 items: square, rectangle, hexagon, circle, or something round, triangle, red, purple, felt, bead, button, safety pin, a word, a number, appliqué, ribbon, rick-rack, sequin or crystal, fancy stitch, embroidery floss or special thread. See Mary Alice for hand out.

Exchanges: Robyn Baldwin – The ongoing exchange is 20 – 10-inch square batik blocks. Please make sure all blocks are exactly 10 inches square. There were a few that were a little small. There will be a file box at each meeting where you can pick up your beautiful collection of batik squares.

Greeter: Karen Kimmell passed out name tags, made sure everyone signed in and awarded the door prize.

Hospitality: Annette Paulson -reminded us to sign up for our birthday month to bring snacks.

Membership: Maureen Wasson – Please make sure your membership dues are up to date. 18 members have still not paid dues.

Program: Pat Guilford – The program tonight is collage quilting. Patterns for different animals, adhesive and fabrics will be provided. There are 6 people signed up for the Sally Terry class so it will remain as scheduled.

The 1<sup>st</sup> annual Honeybee Quilt Guild Home Studio Tour will be held on Saturday, May 16<sup>th</sup>, and will begin with a continental breakfast at Connie Kight's home located at, 106 Cedar Street, San Mateo, FL 32187, at 9:00 a.m. There will be lots of fun, food, shopping and inspiration. The cost is only \$5 but bring your credit card just in case Miss D's Quilt shop has something you can't live without. September: "Twenty-Twenty" Honeybee Guild Challenge

- To mark the beginning of a new decade we are having a "Twenty-Twenty" challenge. Your project may be any theme that you wish, but it can be no larger than 20x20.
- Your project must have at least one each of the following 20 items. The 20 items must be located on the front of your project.
- 1. A square
   2. A rectangle
   3. A hexagon
   4. A circle (or something round)
   8. A piece of felt
   9. A bead
   16. A piece of ribbon
   17. A piece of rick-rack
   18. A sequin or crystal
- 5. A triangle
  6. The color red
  12. A word (any word)
  13. A number (any number)
  19. Fancy stitch (machine or hand)
  20. Embroidery floss or special thread.
- 7. The color purple 14. Applique (machine or hand)

Remember it is one of each item
