Abstraction Supply List Finished Quilt Sizes: Lap (64" x 64") and Full/Queen (83" x 97")

This unique sphere design is created by choosing three different fabric values, on a light background. The Four Patch tool provides accurate squares and rectangles to piece together creating this geometric Abstraction.

Supply List: Studio 180 Design pattern Abstraction Four Patch Square Up tool 6 x 24 (approximate) Ruler Rotary Cutter

Sewing Machine in good working order

Sewing supplies you like to use - 1/4" foot, thread, bobbins, glass head pins, seam ripper, scissors, sewing machine needles, etc.

Fabric Requirements:

Precutting before class: Following the Cutting Instructions on your pattern cut your strips for your blocks. Be sure to label and organize your pieces by units and value. I will provide labeled paper plates for keeping organized during construction. Do not cut Outer Border length. ART QUILT LABELS WITH MO REITER

HONEYBEE MEETING FEB 2025

SUPPLIES:

- Books or any other inspiration for label art
- Fabric for label tight weave to avoid lumps and bumps
 - White or light batiks are great choices
- Pigma pens Mo's favorite size is 005
- Light Box
- Iron with High Cotton Setting
- Crayola Crayons (never a cheaper brand) Optional
- Prisma Colored Pencils Optional
- Art Blender sticks & emery board Optional
- Fun-Tak Poster Putty (one brand is Loctite) Optional

STEPS TO MAKE A LABEL:

- 1) Determine size/image for label copy if from book, copier can resize if needed
 - a. Can draw a box around the images for the label's size to help align label elements
 - b. Can adjust the tracing for the desired label size, i.e. use 2 birds when the image has 3
- 2) Cut fabric at least ½" larger on all sides to be able to fold over and finish in the final steps
- 3) Cut freezer paper to be smaller than the fabric to protect the iron
- 4) Add freezer paper to the back of the label fabric (press in place)
- 5) Use painters tape to attach the drawing face down to freezer paper
- 6) Place the drawing-freezer paper-fabric on the light box, confirm image and text are correctly oriented
- 7) Trace the outline / line drawing / border / text on the label fabric
- 8) Remove the painters tape and drawing
- 9) Repeat steps 5-8 for any design elements to add to the label
- 10) Heat Set the Pen drawing using a high Cotton setting
- 11) To add color:
 - a. For standard spaces add Crayola Crayon colors. Start with lightest color of the space and add darker and darker as desired
 - b. For tighter spaces use Prisma Colored Pencils
- 12) Optional step to blend:
 - a. Use an Art Blender Stick to blend crayon or pencil
 - b. Use the emery board to keep the stick sharp and remove the blended color from the stick
- 13) Optional step to remove color mistakes:
 - a. Pull off some poster putty and dab the putty on the label to remove color from the fabric (before heat setting)
- 14) Blend and Heat Set the color by first placing a clean Paper Towel over the label fabric then using the iron on a high Cotton setting to blend and set the color
 - a. Heating Crayola Crayons will melt the wax and leave the color stain on the fabric
- 15) Trim the label fabric down to size (leaving border to fold)
- 16) Remove the freezer paper
- 17) Press and fold the edges to create a finished edge
- 18) Attach to quilt as desired

NOTES AND HINTS:

- Pens:
 - o Be sure to practice writing on fabric with the pens you will be using
 - o Try different pen sizes and label a sampler for reference
- Label Components:
 - o Practice drawing on label fabric
 - o Practice writing by placing lined paper behind the fabric using light box
- Resources:
 - o Crab Apple Hill Studios in Seattle has great art
 - Pigma Pens can be found at Hobby Lobby, Michaels, Cinnamons by the register or even North Main Art Supply
 - o Best time to buy Crayola Crayons is the back to school sales
